Dr. B yce, secretary of the Provincial B ard of Health, reported to the Ontario Legislature that in 1899 there were 23 472 deaths in that Province This meant 10 to every 1 000 population, which he believes is the lowest death rate in the world. In contagious diseases there was a great decrease. In 1897 there were 1 755 deaths from contagions diseases, while in 1899 there were only 1,094. Diphtheria only caused 363 deaths last year, while in 1864 the number was 1,075.
