She said it mattered not how prayerfully she prepared the lesson with the hope of impressing or reaching him, he not only thwarted her efforts to render the lesson profitable to him self, but disturbed the whole class, so that it became painful to her and distracting to them.

One of the most abused words is got. A boy says, I have got a cold, when he means he has a cold. A girl remarks, My mother has got a fine head of hair, which would only be true if her mother wore a wig; otherwise the word got should be omitted.

Many of you say, We have twenty scholars in our class, or ninety scholars in our school, when you should say, pupils. A scholar, strictly speaking, is a learned man, or one who devotes himself to writing, in the sense of literature. A pupil is one who is under instruction, a young person who attends school.

The other day his mistress sent him upstairs to get her slippers. He came down presently with one, and she sent him back for the other, but again he returned without it.

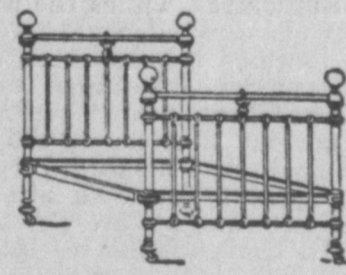
