The military authorities at Halifax, have been advised that the troopship will leave Portsmouth England, for Halifax on Feb. 12th, and to have the Leinster Regiment in readiness for embarkation from Halifax on Feb. 21st. The Leinster Regiment will go to South Africa.

A Sydney letter says: "Within the last few months one hundred and ten new buildings have sprung into existence in this town. They include some very fine brick business blocks. The bulk of the buildings are dwelling houses. Despite this large addition to the number of residences there is now scarcely living room.

It is stated authoritatively that the transport Milwaukee cannot be got ready for sea before the 20th inst. It will probably sail on that date from Halifax for South Africa.

On Saturday a fire at Glace Bay destroyed a large tenement house and two lives were lost. Several women threw their children from the second story windows and jumped after them. All were safely caught.

Another case of small pox appeared at Moncton on Saturday, the victim being a man named Coleman, employed in the I. C. R. shops. Coleman belongs to Hampton, New Brunswick.

OTHER PROVINCES.

At Sandwich, Ont., Tuesday, Levi Stewart, colored, convicted of the murder of James Ross, also colored, was hanged.

At Red Portage, Man., Thursday, Isaac Todd was instantly killed while thawing dynamite, which exploded, tearing his body into fragments.

A bad outbreak of smallpox is reported from Toronto Junction. In a large boarding house, frequented by railway men, there are five cases. Railway men from all over the provinces have been going out and in on their regular trips.

Burglars blew open the vault and safe of the Danville P. Q. branch of the People's Bank of Halifax early Tuesday morning. They cleared the safe of its contents, securing about \$5,000 in cash.

Thursday evening at Windsor mill six burglars were captured. A posse of citizens met the burglars on the outskirts of the town. The burglars drew revolvers and blazed away at the posse, and return fire was made with rifles, shot guns and revolvers.

Louis Gabriel, a pro-Ber sympathizer in Winnipeg, who undertook the other day to make a speech on the war, was met with groans and hisses, and, later, a volley of old eggs.

UNITED STATES.

Kentucky within a fortnight had a Governor and a member of the legislature assassinated.

A recent report to the New York Board of Health says there are several cases of leprosy at that city.

Wm. F. Miller, the head of the notorious "Franklin syndicate" in Brooklyn, which promised to pay and did pay to many persons 520 per cent, on investments, and who has been eluding the police since November, has been captured in Canada and taken to New York.

The Cooperage and Woodware Company's plant at Escanaba, Mich., was destroyed by fire Thursday. The loss is estimated at \$250,000.

A wind storm, which almost reached the velocity of a tornado, swept Western Indiana and Eastern Illinois Thursday morning. Telephone and telegraph wires were seriously affected.

Sir Charles Tupper has accepted an invitation to address a monster mass meeting to be held in B. seton in March in aid of the British South African patriotic fund.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN.

There were 219 cases of sunstrokes at Buenos Ayres on Sunday, of which 134 were fatal.

The mortality in Bombay on Tuesday, of last week was unprecedented. There was a total of 598 deaths. The situation is aggravated by the advent of famine refugees.

Sir Henry M. Stanley, the African explorer, was taken suddenly ill with gastritis in the House of Commons Wednesday night and is in a somewhat serious condition.

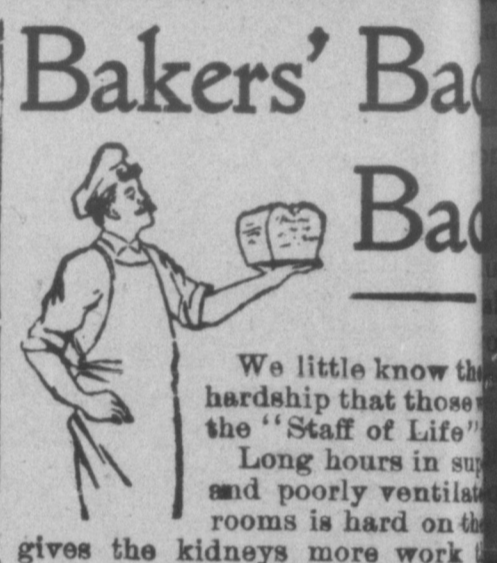
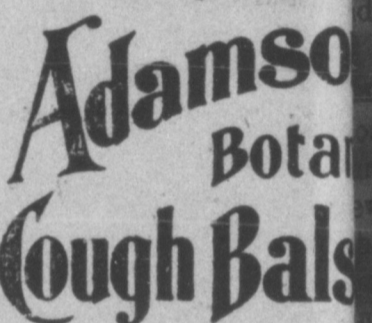
