News of the Week

NEW BRUNSWICK

The Gleaner says that Donald Fraser & Sons will cut at their Fredericton and Temiscouata mills this year 30,000,000 of long lumber and 60,000,000 shingles. In the spring they will start building 125 cottages for their employes at Temiscouata.

A large party of English emigrants passed through St. John last week on their way to the Northwest. They were a fine looking lot.

More news from Carleton county shows the late storm to have been unequalled in severity within the memory of most people. It is said that between seventy-five and one hundred barns were unroofed, and one case is reported of a barn falling in and almost all the stock being killed.

It is stated that the Grand Manan Stevedore Company is considering the advisability of purchasing a steamer to replace the Flushing on the route between Grand Manan, St. Stephen and St. John and that the new boat will probably be the Salacta, now owned in New York and formerly on the Bangor-Portland route. She is a twin-screw propeller, 200 tons larger than the Flushing, steams 14 knots and draws eight feet of water. She is a handsome boat, built in 1895, lighted by electricity throughout and admirably adapted for this route. It is expected that, if secured, she will be in command of the popular John Ingersoll and will make daily trips in the summer and tri-weekly during the winter.

The storm of the 1st inst. did much damage at Campobello, particularly along the shores, where the tides washed buildings away. It was the highest tide for twenty years.

More cases of small-pox have broken out in three sections of Campbellton.

On the 2nd inst. Grand Manan had one of the highest tides for eight or nine years, and much damage was done to fish houses, slips and wharves. White Head probably suffered the most.

In St. John, Friday night, Mrs. Nettie Newcomb, wife of Chas. Newcomb, was sent to the hospital suffering from the effects of an overdose of laudanum. She had attempted suicide. A stomach pump saved her life, though she protested that she wanted to be allowed to die.

The recent re-outbreak of smallpox at Campbellton is due to violations of the public health regulations by the concealment of cases in dwelling houses. The local board of health will prosecute all violators of the health act and regulations, and on Saturday Gilbert Petre and Donald Petre were arrested for breaking quarantine.

Sch. Jennie C bound from Black's Harbor for St. John, ran a horse Sunday afternoon in Courtenay Bay, near the foot of Sheffield street. The vessel fell off and sank. Capt. Lee and his crew got ashore without difficulty.

It is understood in government circles in Halifax that Mr. William Law, the senior local member for Yarmouth county, will be called to the legislative council to fill the vacancy in that body caused by the death of the late L. E. Baker.
A syndicate composed of Cape Breton capitalists are about to start a flour and corn mill at Sydney.
Evan Brown of Mira, C. B., died on the 5th inst. at the age of 103 years.
A \$7,000 brick of gold came in Monday to George A. Pyke from the Richardson gold mine, the result of last month's work at that property.

Guyville Johnson, of H company, first Canadian contingent, who died of wounds received in the engagement at Peledberg on the 18th of February, was a son of Captain Robert Johnson of Black Point, N. S., who had the misfortune to lose both eyes in a blasting accident several years ago.
Rev. Norman B. Dunn, (Baptist) of Deerfield, Yarmouth County, mixed what he thought was a regular dose of medicine Saturday 3rd inst., and took it. He immediately discovered he had made a mistake and antidotes were administered, but he was dead in fifteen minutes. He leaves a widow and two children.

The Dominion Coal Company has announced an increase of forty cents per ton at their mines.
The scarcity of quarters in the town of Sydney is well shown by the fact that a five roomed one and one half story building, occupied by a man, his wife and two grown up daughters, shelters 21 boarders.
The Nova Scotia Carriage Co. have fifty-two men employed in their factory at Kentville.

Off Barrington Friday fishermen found the foretopmast of a barque or barquentine, broken off at the cross-tree, floating with deals and other wreckage from the recent disaster. This strengthens the belief that the steamship Planet Mercury was sunk in collision and that the disaster of Feb. 18 was twofold.

Sydney, C. B., is to have among its other improvements a daily paper, which will be established by a company of Montreal capitalists.
In the N. S. Legislature the smaller Bridges bill has passed. Petitions were received in favor of a railway line from Halifax direct to New Germany. The Premier introduced a bill to provide for the establishment of a School of Agriculture and Technology for the Maritime Provinces. He also introduced a bill to establish a Sanatorium for consumptives.

UNITED STATES
The most disastrous mine explosion ever known in the New River district occurred at the Red Ash mine, W. Va., Tuesday. It is believed that the victims will number fifty.
Dan Mimms, a young farmer living twenty miles from Buxley, Ga., was murdered by two negro robbers Monday. He was on his porch when attacked, and when his wife ran out the robbers had killed him. She tried to escape with her baby, but the negroes killed the child and beat her so cruelly that her life is despaired of.
In Philadelphia Wednesday, a fire entailing an estimated loss of over \$800,000 occurred in the retail dry goods district. About 1,500 persons, men, women and children, are thrown out of employment.
The private car of the Lewis Morrison Company caught fire from the explosion of a gasoline stove about ten miles from Calais en route to Bangor over the W. C. R. R. Company.

Hon. E. J. Phelps, former United States minister to England, died at New Haven on Friday.
Discussion of Mr. Mason's resolution expressing sympathy for the Boers was conducted in the United States Senate Friday behind closed doors.
At Bridgeport, Conn., Wednesday, Chas. B. Cross, a seventeen year old boy was convicted of the murder of Mrs. Sarah C. King, a woman of over sixty years. He was sentenced to be hanged July 20.
At Frankford, Ky., W. H. Coulton, a clerk in the office of State Auditor Sweeney, has been arrested charged with complicity in the murder of the late Governor Wm. Goebel. Warrants have also been issued for the arrest of Secretary of State Powers and the policemen of the state capital squad. The warrants charge them with being accessory to the Goebel assassination, other arrests are likely.

Ten children, members of the Universalist church Sunday school at Bangor, Me., were struck and almost all of them were completely buried by a snowslide which came off the roof of the church at noon Sunday.
In Boston an early Sunday morning fire in the building occupied by the Massachusetts Maccaroni Company on North street, caused the death of one fireman, the probably fatal injury of another and the serious injury of three others, besides entailing a financial loss estimated from \$75,000 to \$150,000.

Sixteen miners have been killed by an explosion in a coal pit at Bosauges, France. The galleries of the mine collapsed, burying the bodies of the victims.
A PROOF TO THE POINT.
The almshouse commissioners of Charlotte county recently called for tenders for the supplies required by the institution during the current year. The various articles were enumerated, and in every case a high standard of quality was set. In the item of tea the commissioners stipulated that it must be "Red Rose or equal."
Red Rose tea is blended and packed by T. H. Estabrooks, the North wharf tea importer and blender, and he has persistently declared it to be the best value in the market. It was therefore most gratifying to him to learn that Red Rose was thus prominently named as a standard by which other teas were to be judged.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN.

President Jablonski, of the Polish National Alliance, is authority for the statement that many Poles are being recruited into British regiments. They are being sent he says, not to South Africa but to India, so they may fight against Russia in the event that war with that country breaks out.

The bubonic plague increases, there being 411 deaths from the disease at Calcutta last week. This is caused by a great exodus of mechanics. The Viceroy, Lord Curzon, had expressed some of the plague stricken patients, said he considered it his duty to visit all the quarters of the vast dependence committed to his charge.

Her Majesty has been led her extended visit to the Italian Riviera.

The British punitive expedition sent to avenge the murder, in the Manghem district, of Messrs. Kiddie and Sutherland, British commissioners, who had been engaged in the demarcation of the Burmo-Chinese boundary has captured the whole group of villagers implicated in the affair. Sixty of the villagers have been killed and 2000 houses have been burned.

It is announced that the Queen intends to visit Ireland for the first time since the death of the Prince Consort.

The British steamer Cavier, from Antwerp for Brazil was sunk in collision with an unknown steamer. The second mate and two seamen were picked up by a passing ship; the rest of the crew, it is feared, were drowned. The Cavier was a freight steamer and probably carried a crew of about fifty men.
