News of the Week

NEW BRUNSWICK

Boutillier, the desperate convict who was caught trying to saw his way out of his cell in the Dorchester prison two or three months ago, made another attempt at escape the other day. This time by digging a hole under the wall.

Among the justices of the peace in Gloucester who have taken the oath of allegiance to King Edward VII is Joseph Sewell, of Pokemouche, who was born April 8, 1800, and was sworn Nov. 16, 1901, to bear true allegiance to the king. He wore no glasses in signing the oath, and wrote a firm hand.

The scarcity of water in Chatham, has become very serious. A great number of wells are dry and water is being sold at 10 cents a barrel.

Gardener Briggs, young son of George Briggs, of Lakeville Corner, S. Co. had his leg badly crushed Wednesday, while getting boom poles a short distance from the house.

At St. Stephen, Wednesday, fire badly damaged the building occupied by Attorneys L. A. & N. M. Mills and the Public Library.

John Blair, caretaker of the exhibition buildings of Fredericton claims that he is the only surviving relative of Marcus Blair who died recently at St. Louis leaving an estate valued at \$8000.

Walter Crocker of Derby, Northumberland Co. died suddenly on Tuesday of last week in the woods at Doaktown where he had gone on a shooting trip. He was 28 years of age.

Wm. Richards states that lumber operations on the Southwest Miramichi are progressing well, the weather being favorable. Operations are not being carried on upon as extensive a scale as in former years, men being scarce and wages and prices of supplies high.

Of Grand Manan fisheries it is stated that herring fishing is about over with the weir fishermen for this season. There is not an average catch of herrings this year, but the catch is more evenly distributed among the weirs than last year's. Net fishermen have had a fairly good season, the

The Moncton water supply is said to be very weak. Intercolonial engineers have received orders to fill their tanks with water at nearest tank outside Moncton.

NOVA SCOTIA

Last year lobster fishing was allowed in St. Mary's Bay, Digby Co., from Dec. 15th. It has been found to be a most detrimental procedure, and this season fishing in the bay will not be allowed before January 15th.

The suicide found in the woods near Dartmouth a few days ago has been identified. His name was John Beverley.

The smallpox of Kentville seems to be dying out. No new cases have been reported this month, and all the patients are doing well.

Stephen Doyle, caretaker of Mount Olivet cemetery, Halifax, was fatally shot Wednesday, by the accidental discharge of a gun which his companion Stephen Kline was carrying.

Schr. Florence, from Harborville for Parrboro, with apples, ran ashore

on Spencer's Island during the gale a few days ago and was badly damaged.

A burglary was committed at Centreville, Cape Island, on Monday night of last week. A thief entered the store of James McGray, opened the safe and took the reform \$1,166 in bank notes, one of the notes being for \$500.

William Stevenson, aged 36 years of North Williamstown near Lawrence town, committed suicide on Sunday by drowning, after a vain attempt to cut his throat. He had been suffering from the effects of fever.

At Yarmouth the high tide Monday did extensive damage. The bridge at the aboteau at Eel Brook, is a wreck, the iron girders and cement walls going down with it. Over 30 tons of dyke hay at Glenwood were carried out with the tide and more or less destroyed. The wharves in town were overflowed, and many goods were damaged.

The school house at Gardiner Mines C. B. was destroyed by fire Wednesday night. Loss \$500. Supposed to be incendiary.

Maud Caudle, on Wednesday stopped in at a store while going home to dinner from the Truro Knitting Mills. She sat upon a chair and was being waited on when she suddenly died. She was but 18 years of age.

OTHER PROVINCES

Over a hundred cases of smallpox exist in Ontario, scattered throughout 22 municipalities.

Dr. Bryce, chief medical health officer in Ontario, reports the smallpox situation very unsatisfactory in that province. Twenty new cases were reported from the lumber woods of northern Ontario within a week. Dr. Bryce predicts an extensive outbreak during the winter and urges everybody to be vaccinated.

Owing to the upward tendency of land values, the Manitoba government has advanced the price of all provincial lands by 50 cents an acre.

A schooner was wrecked, another foundered, while still another is missing from the port of St. John's Nfld., as the result of the severe gale which raged there Friday.

Alex. McRitchie, an aged farmer living at Scotland, Ont., slipped and fell into a 40 foot well on his farm Thursday and was drowned.

This season's shipment of cheese at Montreal was comparatively unsatisfactory. The butter trade was a success. The cost value of 410,000 packages was \$6,027,000, compared with 258,000 packages last season at cost value of \$3,640,000.

At Charlottetown, while shooting partridge, Thursday, Percy Vanidestine, aged nineteen, was accidentally shot by William Vanidestine, his cousin, and died in a short time.

UNITED STATES

The weather is so cold in New York state that the ice dealers will commence harvesting their crop next week.

Wednesday fire gutted the Calais Wrapper Factory and retail store of the company. Water and fire destroyed nearly all the stock. Insured.

In Detroit, twenty men are dead, five of them unidentified and so terribly burned and blackened that identification is almost impossible, and 24 other men and boys are in the various hospitals of the city suffering from frightful cuts and burns and other injuries, all results of the explosion of

one of the boilers in the Penberthy Injector Co.'s plant Tuesday of last week.

The barn and stable belonging to the residence of Capt. John Murchie, Calais, were burned Thursday evening, with most of their contents, including one horse.

In New York Thursday, property worth \$750,000 to a million dollars is the estimate of the loss by a fire in the vicinity of Tenth street and the East River. Several firemen were hurt, but no one seriously. The fire started in the plant of W. E. Uptegrove & Bros., manufacturers of boxes, veneers and fine woodwork, and this firm was the principal sufferer. One of its buildings was a seven story structure.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

The tailors of Cairo, Egypt, have gone out on a strike for higher wages. A strike is a rare occurrence in Egypt.

Trade depression in Germany continues. Great merchants of yesterday stand to-day ruined. Manufacturing cities are full of hungry men. Numbers of works are closed altogether, and others are reducing their output, and the stocks of German iron works are being sold in Belgium and England for what they will fetch. Germany attempted too much, and is reaping the inevitable result. Bad finance, over-capitalization and excess of credit are mentioned as the causes.

A tidal wave, accompanied by strong winds, has done much damage along the eastern coast of England from Norfolk to Kent. Rivers have overflowed their banks, dams and sea walls have been invaded, and miles of country have been submerged.

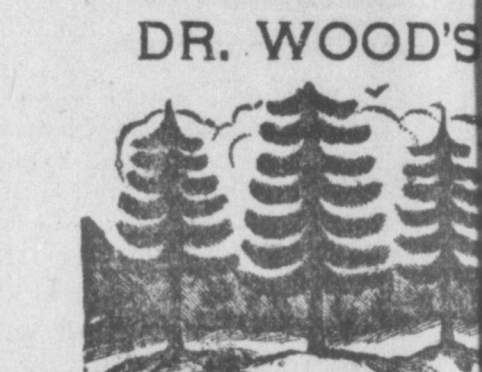
