News of the Week

NEW BRUNSWICK

Tuttle Allen, a prisoner confined in Dorchester jail, escaped Thursday afternoon and is still at large.

Harry Fradsham of this city while partridge hunting accidentally discharged his gun badly burning and mangling his hand.

A collision on the C. P. R. at Fredericton Junction, Wednesday, resulted in the destruction of two cars. No body was hurt.

Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Kierstead, of Collina, Kings Co. recently celebrated the 70th anniversary of their marriage. Mr. Kierstead is 92, and Mrs. Kierstead is 88.

At a meeting of the local government last week bonuses were granted to two new flour mills. One in York county will receive \$1,000 and one at Grand Anse \$750.

Applications have been made for two new post offices in York Co., one at Durham Settlement and one at New Maryland. Inspector Colter will probably recommend both.

A house a short distance below Oromocto, owned by Patrick Powers and recently occupied by a family named Knox, was burned to the ground Friday night. There was no insurance. Incendiarism is suspected.

Captain W. J. Brittain, of Norton, on Wednesday was coming from Hanpton with a load of lumber and in going over the Central Railway crossing fell off the load and the heavy wagon passed over him broke his collar bone and otherwise injured him.

The directors of the Woodstock and Central Railway at a recent meeting decided to sign a contract for the construction of the road with Henry Crine, of New York, on his producing satisfactory evidence of his ability to carry on the work. The idea is to have the work commenced in April next and completed in eighteen months.

OTHER PROVINCES

James H. Lewis, Christian Scientist, of Toronto, was found guilty of manslaughter in neglecting to give medical aid to his boy, who died of diphtheria. He was released on bail.

The Ontario mines report shows a marked increase of production for the past nine months. The report shows an aggregate of \$2,822,003, compared with \$2,541,131 for the whole year of 1901, a proportionate increase of about 48 per cent. This is the highest production yet reached by the miners in that province. The heaviest increases are in iron ore, which increased from \$111,805 in 1900, to \$224,546 for the first nine months of the present year; pig iron from \$936,066 to \$1,296,344, and nickel from \$756,626 to \$937,214.

UNITED STATES

There are 40,000 cases of smallpox in the United States.

The pack this year of the 90 sardine factories in Maine will be the largest on record, being about 1,500,000 cases. The factories employ 8000 persons during the season.

Leslie Bowker, of Marshfield, Me., died from a bullet wound, the victim of a hunter's mistake. Bowker was gunning in the vicinity of Great Falls, and was shot by a gunner in the woods.

The whaling season just closed, has been disastrous for San Francisco fleet. The total catch of the fleet was 38 whales which will entitle the crews of the steamers to one dollar each for a season of nine months.

Wednesday night Mrs. Guy Pimbell, of Norwalk, Conn., attempted to replenish the oil in a lighted lamp and an explosion resulted. Two of her children were burned to death. The mother and another daughter were terribly burned.

At Leavenworth, Kan., one man was killed, three others dangerously wounded and 26 desperate convicts escaped as a result of a mutiny Thursday at the site of the new United States prison, were 400 prisoners in charge of 30 armed guards, were at work.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

The scarcity of money at Cahn, Russia, is so serious that most of the naphtha firms have been obliged to curtail operations.

Prospects for the rice harvest in Japan are excellent, returns showing the condition to be one-tenth better than the average.

It is announced in a despatch to a news agency from St. Petersburg that scores of fishing boats were wrecked and 170 men drowned during a recent storm on Lake Baikal, Siberia.

At a public meeting of the leading men of Jamaica held in Kingston on Wednesday, a resolution was adopted asking the British government not to send Boer prisoners to Jamaica.

Sir Michael Hicks-Beach, Chancellor of the Exchequer, in a speech at Bristol, Monday, said that he might have to ask the people to bear even greater burdens and to make greater sacrifices next year.

On Monday a man named Lanscombe entered the Kensington branch of the London and Southwestern Bank, in London, and shot the cashier dead. A clerk grappled with the robber, who, finding that escape was impossible, shot himself.

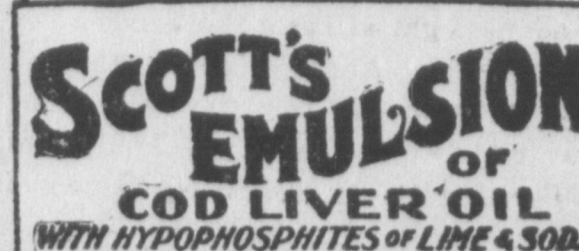
