NEW BRUNSWICK

The death occurred on Saturday morning last, quite suddenly, of A. D. Yerxa Esq. Register York Co. He had been in quite poor health for some time past, as was just preparing to go to Boston to spend Xmas with his daughter.

The St. John civic delegation appointed to visit the principal cities on the Atlantic coast which possess dry docks, left for Boston Wednesday afternoon. OTHER PROVINCES

Madame Alph nse Gregorie, of St. Francis du Lac, died suddenly Friday morning. She was suffering from small pox and took poison in mistake for her medicine. A physician was called, but arrived too late for an emetic administered to be effective.

Two members of a theatrical company arrived in Winnipeg on Thursday on a train from the South suffering from small pox. They were immediately quarantined.

High Constable Gale of Quebec arrested at Thetford Mines. O'dillon Gregoire, aged 22 accused of causing the death of Edmund Landry aged 29 by striking him in the head with a hammer in the course of a dispute. The doctors held a post mortem and declared death resulted from a blow.

Judge Britton at Sault Ste. Marie sentenced Frederick Schults, alias Lindsley, to hang on Feb. 7 for the murder of his paramour, Mrs. Mary Craig, in August last.

Dr. Leslie M. Sweetman, a prominent surgeon of Toronto University, died of blood poisoning which he contracted at St. Michael's Hospital while operating on a patient whose arm had been shattered by a gunshot wound. The patient died of blood poisoning.

There are ninety cases of small-pox in northern Ontario.

It is authoritatively stated that plans for the big shipbuilding plant to be located at Sault Ste. Marie by English capitalists, headed by Sir Christopher Furness, are now prepared and a site chosen.

Manitoba's crop report, prepared by the Department of Agriculture, shows a total grain yield this year of 85,179,858 bushels.

The London correspondent of the Tribune says it is stated that an important agreement will shortly be arrived at in connection with the proposed fast mail service in Canada. Correspondence is now proceeding between the Dominion authorities and the colonial office on the subject, and it is understood that the long standing difficulty as to the proportion of the subsidy to be borne by the Imperial government will be disposed of by the Dominion government meeting a greater contribution upon condition that the contractors give special facilities for carrying Canadian dairy and other produce for the home markets.

The residence of Alvin Flanders Fitch Bay, Que. was burnt about nine o'clock Sunday night. It is not known how the fire originated, but it burnt fiercely and quickly owing to a strong gale, and it was with difficulty any of the inmates could be rescued. One an aged, bedridden lady, Mrs. Emily Cupples, was burned to death. An inquest will be held.

UNITED STATES

Adolph Oppheimer, who was one of the principal witnesses against Theodore Durant, hanged for the murder of Blanche Lamont at San Francisco, was mysteriously shot and killed this morning. Robbery was the motive, a box containing \$7,500, having been taken from his place. No clue to the assassins.

Abraham Loeser, of the law firm of Benjamin and Loeser, New York, is dead, the result of pneumonia.

A coal famine such as has not prevailed for years now exists at Philadelphia, by reason of which both the coast-wise and West India commerce is entirely crippled. Orders for coal both throughout New England and the West India Islands are pouring in, but the merchants find themselves unable to make shipments, owing to the scarcity of coal at tidewater. This condition in a great measure is due to a scarcity of cars to carry the mineral from the mines.

Pennsylvania crude oil Thursday dropped from 130 to 120

Friday morning a distinct earthquake shock was felt in Salem, Ore. The shock lasted three seconds and the vibrations were from north to south. Windows and dishes rattled but no damage is reported.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

The London Mail says it understands that the case of Col. Arthur Lynch, who recently elected to represent Galway in the House of Commons, will be decided by the House in full session.

The London Times publishes despatch from Valparaiso under Saturday's date announcing that decrees have been published calling out a sufficient number of conscripts and territorial guards to place thirty thousand men at the disposal of Chili, to protect the mountain passes.

Riotous scenes occurred at Northampton Wednesday, when hundreds of shoe operatives demonstrated against the use of new shoe lasting machines. They decided to strike if the factories persisted in the use of labor saving appliances.

The storm which prevailed in London has caused a telegraphic breakdown throughout the United Kingdom unequalled since 1881. The north was practically cut off from the south, and many of the provincial towns so snowbound that the courts were closed owing to the official residing in the country being unable to reach them. The gales in the channel were heavy.
