The residence and out-buildings of Henry B. Witter were destroyed by fire, Tuesday, at New Minas. Matches in the hands of a little grandchild were the cause.

There is an outbreak of small pox at Sheffield's Mills, Cornwallis. Simon Wood, Esq, has died of the disease which was caught by him from visitors from Boston.

Wednesday a portion of the flooring of the large freight shed on pier 6 Halifax went through and a quantity of material fell into the water. In the store were quantities of asphalt, sand, gravel, cement, hay and wire. It is calculated that about 100 tons of asphalt went into the water.

price quoted is 56 to 57 cents at country points.

Ontario reports this year nearly 14 million barrels of apples. This is less than half last year's crop.

The Montreal City Council has granted the Royal Electric Co., the contract for lighting the city for next 5 years for \$60 a lamp. Another company had tendered a lower figure, but "influence" prevailed.
