STATISTICS PROVE MORE DEATHS FROM CONSUMPTION THAN FROM ALL OTHER CONTAGIOUS DISEASES COMBINED—HOW BEST TO COMBAT THIS DISEASE.

The ravages of consumption throughout Canada is something appalling. In the province of Ontario, where statistics of deaths from all diseases are carefully kept, it is shown that 2,286 of the deaths occurred during the year 1901 were due to consumption, or about 40 per cent. more than the number of deaths occurred from all other contagious diseases combined.

The purchase by the Fredericton and Woodstock Steamboat Company of the steamer Aberdeen from the Star Line has been closed.

Whitfield Camp, of St. John, North was knocked overboard from the Schr. Eva Hooper and drowned during a storm while on a voyage from New York. He leaves a widow and one child.

Another wreck occurred on the I. C. R. near Rogersville Saturday morning. Ten cars of a special freight, west bound, were thrown from the track.

Mr. A. J. Moxham has resigned his position as general manager of the Dominion Iron and Steel Company Sydney. He will continue his interest in the business, but other interests in the United States demand more attention than he can give while residing in Sydney.

The people of Lockeport, are surging upon the Nova Scotia government the necessity of a South shore route, between Halifax and Yarmouth.

Joseph S. Dresner, Isaac Fried, David Fried, and Joseph Ba'n, are under arrest at Halifax charged with entering into conspiracy to defraud Saxe & Co. Gault Bros. and the Davison Shoe Co., of Montreal, to the extent of \$10,000.

The loss in the Rhodes, Curry & Co. fire is estimated at about \$30,000, with insurance at \$20,000.

The Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Co. have parcelled their lands at Sydney Mines into lots of 200x80 feet, which lots will be sold to workmen at a specially low rate, the company's object being to secure a class of resident workmen.

It is reported that the Dominion Iron & Steel Company and Dominion Coal Company will likely be amalgamated under one management at an early date.

Pilot Flemming, who was in charge of the Allan Line steamer Grecian when she went ashore at the entrance of Halifax harbor, has been dismissed from the pilot service.

In the Nova Scotia Legislature Wednesday Attorney General Longley, acting premier, presented the financial statement of the province of Nova Scotia Legislature. The total revenue for the year was \$1,090,222.88, and the total expenditure \$1,088,926.56, leaving a surplus of \$1,296.32.

A series of burglaries, started recently in small places in North Colchester and adjoining portions of Cumberland. Thursday night a gang broke into Gordon Crowe's farm Belmont, carried off in a large wagon a quantity of grain and some harness.

The inquiry in the loss of the Allan liner Grecian was concluded Saturday Pilot Flemming contradicted Capt. Harrison and others about being told of variation in the compass and said had the captain used the lead the disaster might have been averted.

A disastrous fire in the car works of Rhodes, Curry & Co. Amherst Saturday morning, destroyed the immense

car erecting shed, 380 feet long, with all contents, including eight box and seven flat cars about ready to run out, beside a large number in frame and a large quantity of lumber. The plant shop connected with this building was also destroyed.

OTHER PROVINCES A serious outbreak of smallpox has been located at the lumber camps and Indian reserves on the eastern shore of Lake Winnipeg.

Hog cholera has broken out in Western Ontario Hogs are being slaughtered wherever infection is supposed to exist.

Fire completely destroyed the E. H. Phelps and Company's extensive spoke factory near St. Catharines, Ont., Loss \$75,000, insurance about \$40,000.

Small pox is so prevalent in the parish of St. Jean, Que., that churches and schools have had to be closed down. There are about forty cases of the disease.

A return issued by the provincial government shows that the mineral production of Ontario increased remarkably last year. The pig iron yield alone is 116,370 tons as compared with 53,984 in 1900; steel to the amount of 14,470 tons was produced, also 4,444 tons nickel and 4,197 of copper.

UNITED STATES In Cleveland, Ohio, a party of seven men and women coasting down hill lost control of their sled and dashed into a stone abutment of a Railway bridge.

The Sanitarium of the Seventh day Adventists at Battle Creek, Mich. was destroyed by fire Tuesday of last week. Four hundred patients were taken out.

At Kansas City, Mo., Wednesday Aaron Julius, a negro, was shot and instantly killed by his wife. The tragedy was the culmination of a quarrel.

A mob of marked men overpowered the jailer at New Madrid, Mo., Monday and took a negro Louis Wright, and hanged him.

In Milwaukee, Wis., Wednesday two firemen are dead and two others seriously injured as the result of the fall of a brick wall at a fire.

H. W. Matheson, cashier of the Intercolonial Bank, Helena, Mont, is under arrest charged with stealing \$178,000.

At Ipswich, Mass., Friday, Captain Benj. Ellsworth, the oldest lighthouse keeper in the world, died, aged 89 years. For 41 years he tended alone the lighthouse at Ipswich Beach, but for the past three years he had been assisted by his daughter.

Early Saturday morning, in New York, fire destroyed the Armory and part of the Park Avenue Hotel. The loss on the Armory is \$650,000, and on the hotel \$100,000. Fifteen persons lost their lives, and fifteen more were injured.

The sleet storm which prevailed in New York Friday and Saturday was the most severe which has been experienced for several years. Telegraphic communication everywhere was almost completely suspended.

The United States army transport McClellan left New York Saturday with 200 school teachers bound for Manila. They are from the middle,

southern and western states. There were 80 women and 120 men.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

A strike of 80,000 workmen is on in Barcelona. There has been rioting with loss of life.

Lord Rosebery has made a notable speech at Liverpool. He has again declared his conviction that the Liberals must have nothing to do with Irish Home Rule.

The bodies of 800 victims of the earthquake at Shamaka, Trans-Caucasia, have thus far been recovered. The treasury has given 55,000 roubles for the relief of the destitute.

From North Rhodesia the British Chartered South Africa Company has received news of the discovery of a copper field estimated at forty square miles. The field is situated 150 miles north of the Victoria Falls, and runs thence to the Congo Free State.
