

UNITED STATES

A terrific explosion occurred Tuesday at the King's Mills Powder Company plant. Its force was felt for miles. Every vestige of the glazing plant was destroyed. Wm. Dunstin, of Mainville, Ohio, was blown to pieces, and David Thompson, of Mason Ohio, was so badly mangled that he died in a few minutes. Charles Harper and a man named Butler, of South Lebanon, were so terribly injured that death is expected any minute.

An affray occurred at Belleville, Tex., Wednesday, which resulted in three men's death, the fatal wounding of one man and the slight wounding of three others.

An explosion in the basement of St. Mary's Catholic church at New Britain, Conn., Tuesday, caused fire which totally destroyed the interior of the structure.

As the result of an explosion in the Lost Creek Mine, Iowa, there are now eight dead, eight injured and twentysix imprisoned with no hope for the entombed men. It is the general opinion that they are already dead.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN

At Belfast, Wednesday thirteen persons were killed and 50 injured at a mill accident.

Owing to the high price of British ways have decided to experiment with Canadian coal, which in all respects equal to that exported to the Baltic

King Emmanuel has cenferred the order of St. Maurice and St. Lazarus upon William Marconi.

Rumors are current in India of coming trouble in Arghanistan. It is allegal that Russia will during the winter mass troops upon the northern frontiers, in readiness to invade Afohanistan as soon as the snow melts on the passes.

SEED GRAIN.—The Department of Agriculture of the Dominion will this season make another distribution of samples of the most productive sorts of grain for the improvement of seed. The stock for distribution is of the very best and has been secured by the Director of the Experimen al Farms from the record-breaking crops recently had in the Canadian North-west. It will be worth while for Canadian farmers generally to renew the r seed of oats when varieties which have produced more than 100 bushels per acre can be had. The distribution this Spring will consist of samples of oats, Spring wheat, barley, field pease, Indian corn and potatoes. Every farmer may apply, but only one sample can be sent to each applicant, hence if an individual receives a sample of oats he cannot also receive one of wheat, barley or potatoes, and applications for more than one sample for one household cannot be entertained. These samples will be sent free of charge through the mail. Application should be address d to the Director of Experimental Farms, Ottawa, and may be sent in any time before the 15th of March.
