

GOLDEN TEXT. - Let us therefore east off the works of darkness and let us put on the whole armour of light.—Rom. 13:12.

LEARN BY HEART.

All the lesson.

LOVE KERPS THE COMMANDMENTS INTEMPERANCE TENDS TO BREAK THEM -Vs. 8, 9. Owe no man anything. This does not forbid contract to pay at a future time, but the violation of obligation to pay when justly due. But to love one another. The believer should keep no other debt in his life than that which a man can never discharge,-that of loving. Leave no debt undischarged, except "the undying debt of love." He that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. The law expresses in words what is the natural fruit of true love in the heart. Perfect love would prompt exactly those actions which the law commands. For this ... and if there be any other commandment, etc. Love thy neighbor as thyself. In measure, not as he always does, but as he ought to. In manner, after the same manner, freely, deeply, sincerely, tenderly, constantly, wisely, without end. The heart of love is a fountain of living waters, and the commandments are the channels through which the streams flow out.
