Time.-The formation of the church at Antioch began some time after the persecution began at the martyrdom of Stephen, and continued to grow. Paul and Barnabas were at Antioch in some part of A D. 43-46. The famine occurred during 43-48. The one in Paleztine A D. 46 according to Ramsay. (Ramsay) or 44 (Lewip).

Place.-Antioch, three hundred miles north of Jerusalem. It was the capital of Syria, and one of the three greatest and most luxurious cities in the world at that time. St. Luke was a native of this city.
