

The Captian thinks the young man had been standing near the boom, and while playing with the reef points, put them around his neck and may have slipped, so that the ropes strangled him and he could not give an alarm.

Two men were killed and one is dying as a result of an accident on the Halifax street railway Sunday evening J.A.Scott and Peter Gilfoy and Chas. Shorten were out driving. At the corner of North street and Windsor road their wagon came in collision with a car of the street railway. The were thrown to the street and the car wheels passing over them, severed the bodies of Gilfoy Shorten and cut off Scott's left arm. The conductor and motorman of the car are under arrest.
