NEW BRUNSWICK

The Bank of New Brunswick will open a branch in Charlottetown in a month.

Thirty-five places of business and fifty dwellings were burned at Marionville, Pa., Wednesday. The loss is estimated at \$20,000.

Steel and Coal Company, Friday the directors, it is understood, decided to extend the works at Trenton, N. S., and install a plant for manufacturing steel cars, calling for a million dollar expenditure.

A find of gold bearing conglomerate has just been made at Grand Lake, about 20 miles from Halifax. A crusher is shortly to be erected.
