#### New Brunswick.

Archie Kennedy, an I. C. R. employe at Moncton charged with stealing brass from the railway shops here, skipped his bail and did not turn up in court when wanted.

The coroner's jury in the case of Mrs. Sillick, Moncton, found that her death was due to wilful and culpable neglect on the part of herself and husband, Charles Sillick, and their advisors, especially J. W. Scott.

The residence of Andrew Brown of Red Bank Ridge, Queens county, was destroyed by fire a few days ago. Only a few articles were saved.

W. Johnson, of New Jerusalem, was very seriously injured by a large bull. He was leading the animal to water when it attacked him.

Alfred Tardy and Baptiste Grondy, while drifting down the St. John river on a catamaran from Edmundston, discovered the body of a man 12 miles above Grand Falls.

On Wednesday a bridge disaster occurred on the Central Railway, resulting in the death of the fireman.

Campbellton has another case of smallpox—a Waverly Hotel employe.

Two young fellows, Ketson and Briggs, are under arrest in St. John, charged with five burglaries recently committed in that city.

Thomas Gillespie, will make a demand on the Isaac Oulton estate for over \$400. This, it is understood, represents the amount Gillespie claims Oulton owed him for board and for commission on collections.

The attorney general states that proceedings will be taken against Sillick, of Moncton, for manslaughter in connection with the death of his wife.

Judge Gregory on Friday made an order for the examination of Kelly at Woodstock on June 12 on application of the United States authorities for extradition.

Emerson Bayton, a log driver, belonging to Newcastle, in this Province, committed suicide at Houlton, on Thursday by shooting. He was 26 years old and unmarried.

The body of George W. McLean was found in the woods at Rosevale, Albert county, Friday. McLean was an old man. He was last seen alive on the premises Sunday.

Saturday night as three Indians were crossing the river from Mission Point to Campbellton the canoe upset and one named Gray was drowned.

Alvin Edgett, 15 years of age, son of William H. Edgetr, blacksmith, was drowned at Humphrey's saw mill pond Sunday afternoon.

#### Nova Scotia.

Dalhousie College governors decided to establish a school of mining in connection with the university. It is the intention to appeal to friends of Dalhousie for an endowment of \$200,000 to put the mining school on a good financial footing.

The will of the late ex-Mayor Hamilton of Halifax provides that his estate, estimated at \$50,000, shall go to his mother during her life, and at her death it provides that the bulk of it shall go to form an endowment for the Halifax Dispensary, a charity of importance to the poor of the city.

Collector Craigie of the Inter-colonial, charged with manslaughter in putting Captain Stewart off a Cape Breton train when he was killed, was discharged by Judge Dadd-Friday, who said Craigie had not exceeded his duty.

One of the towers of the Marconi station at Glace Bay is completed, and the others will be finished in two or three weeks.

Negotiations are in progress by which if completed the Union Bank of Halifax will absorb the Commercial Bank of Windsor.

Schooner Thistle, Captain Boulanger, from Sydney for Quebec, went ashore on St. Paul's Island, about half way from White Point to South-west Lighthouse during a thick fog and a strong north west gale.

The government fish hatchery at Margaree, C. B., was entered Tuesday night and 1,150,000 young fish maliciously destroyed.

#### Other Provinces.

Rev. M. W. Wood, Methodist clergyman, at Cstais, N. W. T., was drowned at that place while attempting to cross a river Wednesday. He was to have been married the following day.

At Springfield, Ont., fire destroyed the Methodist church, Monday, a departmental store, an implement factory, a cheese box factory and three dwelling houses; loss \$50,000; insured \$22,000.

#### British and Foreign.

Australia is suffering from drought. Sheep are dying in large numbers.

Drought still prevails over large areas of Australia, and in consequence of this there will be no export of Australian wheat or flour this year.

The new programme of naval expansion for Japan for six years, beginning 1904, will comprise four battleships of the first class, five battleships of 15,

000 tons each, four second-class cruisers 5,000 tons each, fifteen destroyers, and fifty torpedo boats.

The final election returns in Belgium show that the new chamber of representatives will be composed of 96 Catholics, 34 Liberals, 34 Socialists and two Christian Democrats.

Secret Service officers on Monday arrested a young woman at Tsakos, Siso, the summer residence of the Czar, carrying an infernal machine concealed in a handkerchief.

The German police have begun a systematic campaign against quacks and quack medicines. The police estimate that in ten years the population has increased 58 per cent, and quacks 1567 per cent. There are more women quacks than men.
