Fifty years ago seven shoemaker in a shop in the city of Hambury said: "By the grace of God we will help to send the gospel to our destitute fellow men." In twenty-five years they had established fifty selfsupporting churches, had gathered 10,000 converts, had distributed 400,000 Bibles and $8,000,000$ tracts and had carried the gospel to 50,ooo,000 of the race. It would take only 150 such men to carry the gospel to the world in twenty-five years.

In the town of Kewanee, III., the manufacturing concerns pay out, each week, as wages, $\$ 36,000$. The town has only 8,000 people, so that the operatives must constitute the great bulk of the bread winners of the place. It is also stated that in the banks of Kewanee the weekly deposits of the saloon-keepers amourlt to $\$ 24,000$. Does this indicate that somewhere about half of the wages paid out by the factories goes into the till of the saloon?
-At the celebration of the onc hundredth anniversary of the British and Foreign Bible Society, a short time ago, the Lord Mayor of London, a Jew, presided, and the chief speaker was Mr. Balfour, the Prime Minister of the empire. During the exercises it was stated that the Bible is circulated in 400 languages and dialects, yet there still remain more than $500,000,000$ persons who have never had an opportunity to read any part of it in their own tongue.
