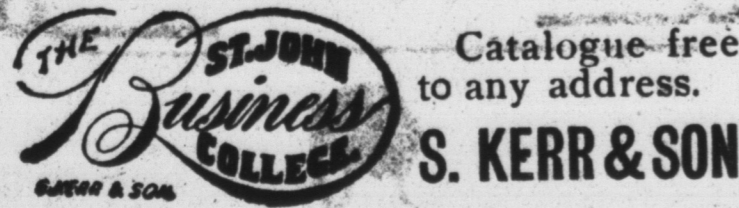

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS.

Those attending Conference may get special rates as follows:

STAR LINE STEAMERS will issue return tickets for one fare.

I. C. R.—Buy a single first-class ticket from starting point to St. John. Get a Standard Certificate from the agent when purchasing ticket. Have the certificate signed by the Secretary of Conference, which, on presentation at St. John, will entitle the holder to a return ticket. Certificates will be honored up to and including three days after the close of Conference.

C. P. R.—The C. P. R. will sell round trip tickets at any station on their line to Tracey for one first-class fare. No certificates needed. Will sell September 13th to 17th, good to return up to September 22.

ABOUT CONFERENCE.

The people of Tracey are making ready for the coming session of Conference. It is difficult to know just how many homes to provide, unless we can form a fair idea of how many will be in attendance.
