RIVERSIDE.

The work is progressing well at Riverside Camp Ground. The Tabernacle will be completed by the time this HIGHWAY is in the hands of the readers. Sleeping accommodations has been added for 68 men, 34 new berths were built in the upper flat of the lodging house, the grounds cleaned up and put in general order, and chairs ordered for the Tabernacle and other improvements are being made. On account of locating the Tabernacle in the place formerly used for crriages, a large horse shed has become a pressing necessity, as hundreds of people come with their teams.

The chairs for Riverside Tabernacle will be ordered by the time you read this. Are you going to contribute one or more? If so, please do so now. We want the money by the time chairs are made.

We will need 8 or 10 large lamps to light the Riverside Tabernacle. This is a good opportunity to let

your light shine, by contributing lamps and lanterns for Riverside.

The berth department needs 34 straw ticks or mattresses, pillow ticks or pillows, sheets or shaker-flannel blankets, pillow cases, quilts and comfortables, good heavy quilts that you have put away are just the thing.

At Robie Maine, May 23rd, of consumption, David G. Varney, aged 62 years and 4 months.

Brother Varney left his home at Vasselboro when 19 years of age for the Aroostook valley, and located on the farm where he has lived ever since, cutting it out of the wilderness by steady persistent labor. He taught school for several years, and was the first Supervisor of Schools in the town now known as Fort Fairfield (then Sarsfield Plantation) he was married 33 years ago to Mary Wentworth, who died a year ago, they raised seven children, but three have died, leaving now, two sons, Alden J., and Chas. W. Varney, who now live on the home-stead, and two daughters, Mrs. J. R. Krins, of Boston, and Miss Gertrude J. Varney.

The Robie church is located on Brother Varney's farm. He having donated the land, and lived to see all of his remaining children active workers in the cause of holiness, which he loved. On account of his poor health, Brother Varney has not been able to attend the meetings much, but always testified when present to the saving power of Christ.

The church was well filled with friends and acquaintances to say the last farewell to a brother who had lived the life of a good citizen, and died trusting in the merits of the blood of Christ.
