While the word "holiness" represents the idea correctly as to a state, or doctrine, or life, the word "sanctification" brings let us respond promptly and cheerwith it the thought of an "act" or fully. "work" that God does in us and for us. And so in the Revised New Testament we have the word "sanctiof the word holiness.

If we carefully consider this fact, it is not without important significance as to our conception of what this this act of God, by the Holy Ghost, produces in our hearts and consciousness a distinct experience. This inward experience is as much a matter of spiritual consciousness as is the experjence of regeneration or the new birth.
