**Beulah Camp Ground.**

We have made mention of the improvements at Beulah since our meetings of 1909 several times, but now as the work is about completed and everything is being put in order pertaining to the beauty of the grounds and the convenience and comfort of the people, it is fitting that we should give space for a few views and a description of a few of the improvements. But we cannot give a full account of the labour performed and money expended. The people must visit Beulah to get an idea of the great changes which have been made. Even then there remains many perplexing things, difficult situations that were encountered and were overcome that cannot be known except by those who bore the burdens. The picture gives our readers three of the four persons who have been directly instrumental in bringing these grand improvements to their present perfection. The one who does not appear in the group and the power behind the throne is our faithful co-labourer, Sister Joseph Bullock. Brother Joseph Bullock has performed the very important part of financier and advisor.

Brother J. F. Bullock has designed the improvements and met the difficulties and overcame them, and carried his plans into effect which has resulted in Beulah being the most beautiful and best equipped camp ground in Canada, and probably in North America.

Brother S. H. Clark's part was that of superintending the men while engaged in the work.

The new additions and improvements have cost about \$8000. This includes changing of the public road and building two bridges, and a heavy wire fence enclosing the entire camp ground property. A beautiful artificial lake covers about two acres of land spanned by a finely built cedar foot bridge and furnished with two pretty little boats. There is a good water system by which the beautiful spring water is conveyed to all parts of the grounds, and an excellent sewerage system connected with the hotel and dormitories. The extension of

the avenues and building of new ones, underbrushing the groves and ravines, excavating the large cellar for the hotel and putting in fillings requiring hundreds of tons of earth, building a dam at the foot of the lake, building a water way for the waste water from the foot of the lake to the river, a distance of 200 feet.

In addition to all these grand improvements and much more that we have not mentioned, Brother J F Bullock's plan included the building of the largest and best summer hotel on the beautiful St John river. Mr S C Page who is an expert builder, with a competent force of carpenters began the work on the hotel the first of March and completed the work by the first of May. The plumbers and painters are now putting on the finishing touches. The Alliance Executive have been associated with Bro J F Bullock in procuring materials and furnishings for the hotel. We have given in a previous number the dimensions of the building which is 104 x 88 feet on the ground. The dining room is the largest in the province being 35 x 82 feet, a seating capacity for over 200 guests. The kitchen is furnished with three large cooking ranges, and modern appliances. Hot water boilers furnishes an abundance of hot water for the laundry and all other purposes. A hot air furnace is installed for heating on wet days. Modern conveniences have been installed on both flats. The second flat contains twenty-two large airy bed-rooms with closets for trunks and clothing. In addition to the new hotel; The old dining room has been converted into sleeping rooms, and modern sanitary conveniences have been installed in the old hotel building and in the Dormitory. So that now Beulah is fully fitted for the convenience, health, happiness and salvation of the people. Beulah is quite ideal in every respect. It is a beautiful memorial for Brother and Sister Bullock, and a living testimony of the skill, energy and push of Brother J F Bullock, and a good example to the other christian denominations to provide themselves with buildings and grounds where they can hold their annual gatherings, and

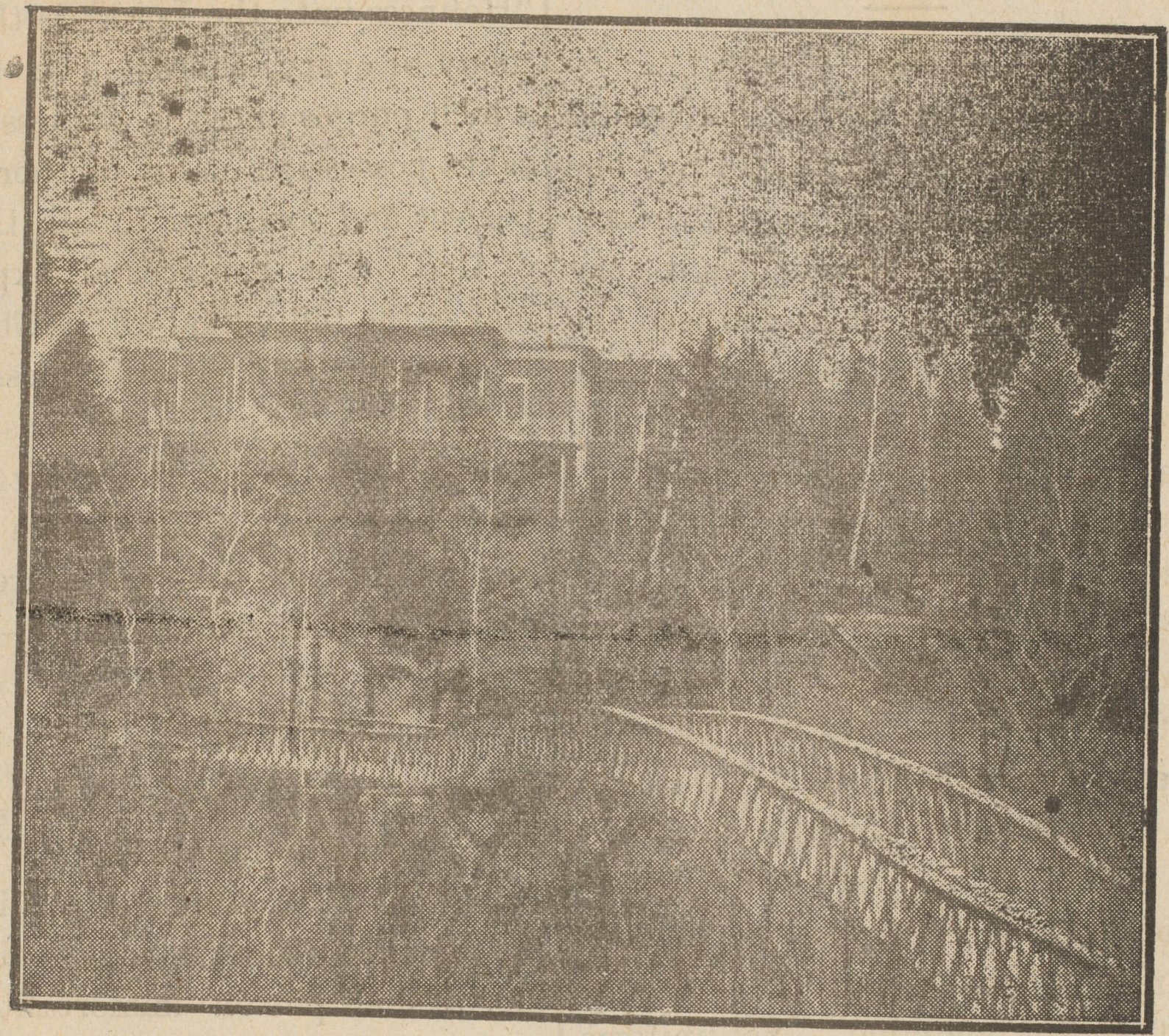
at the same time be instrumental in the conversion of hundreds of people the building up of church of Christ, and blessing the world.

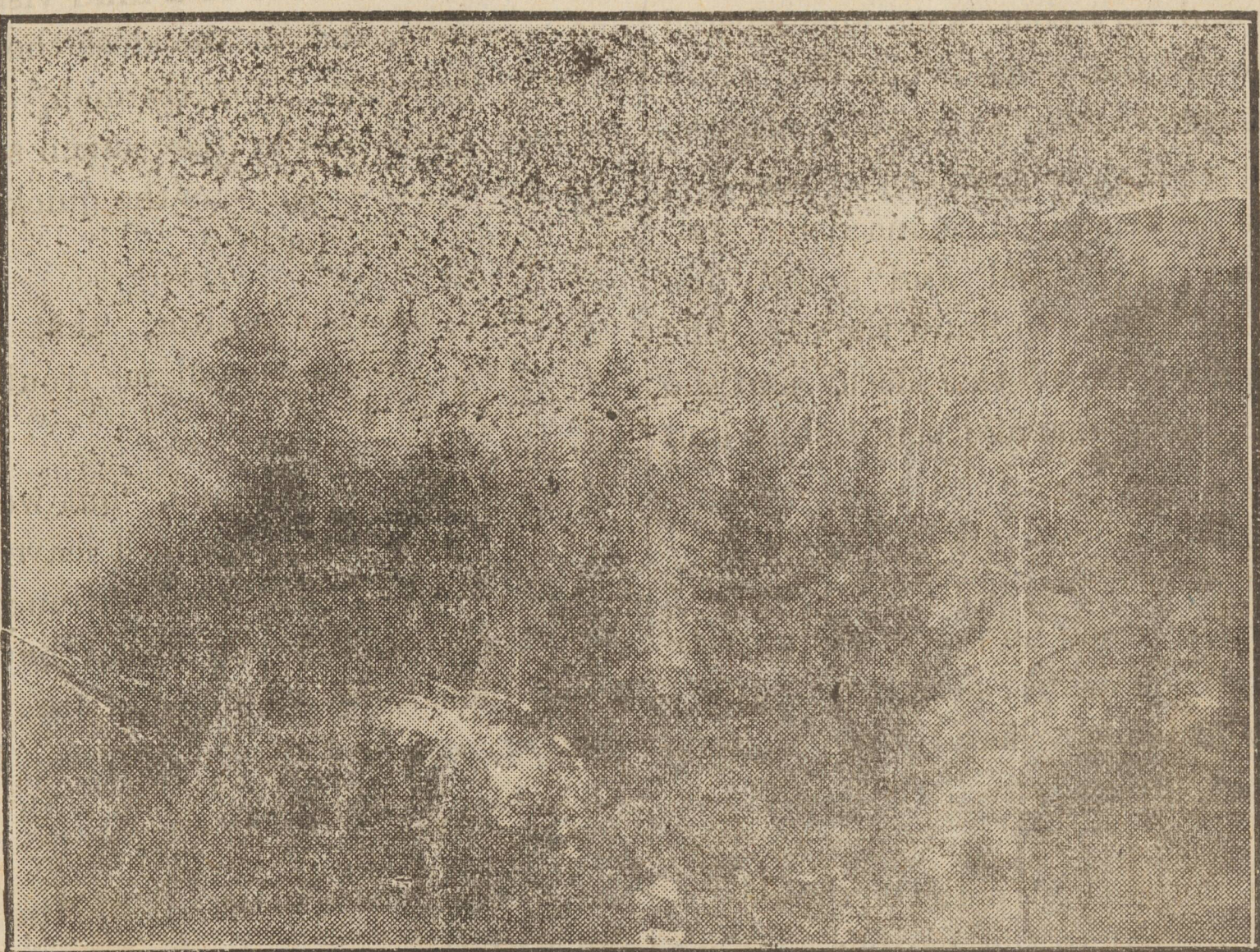

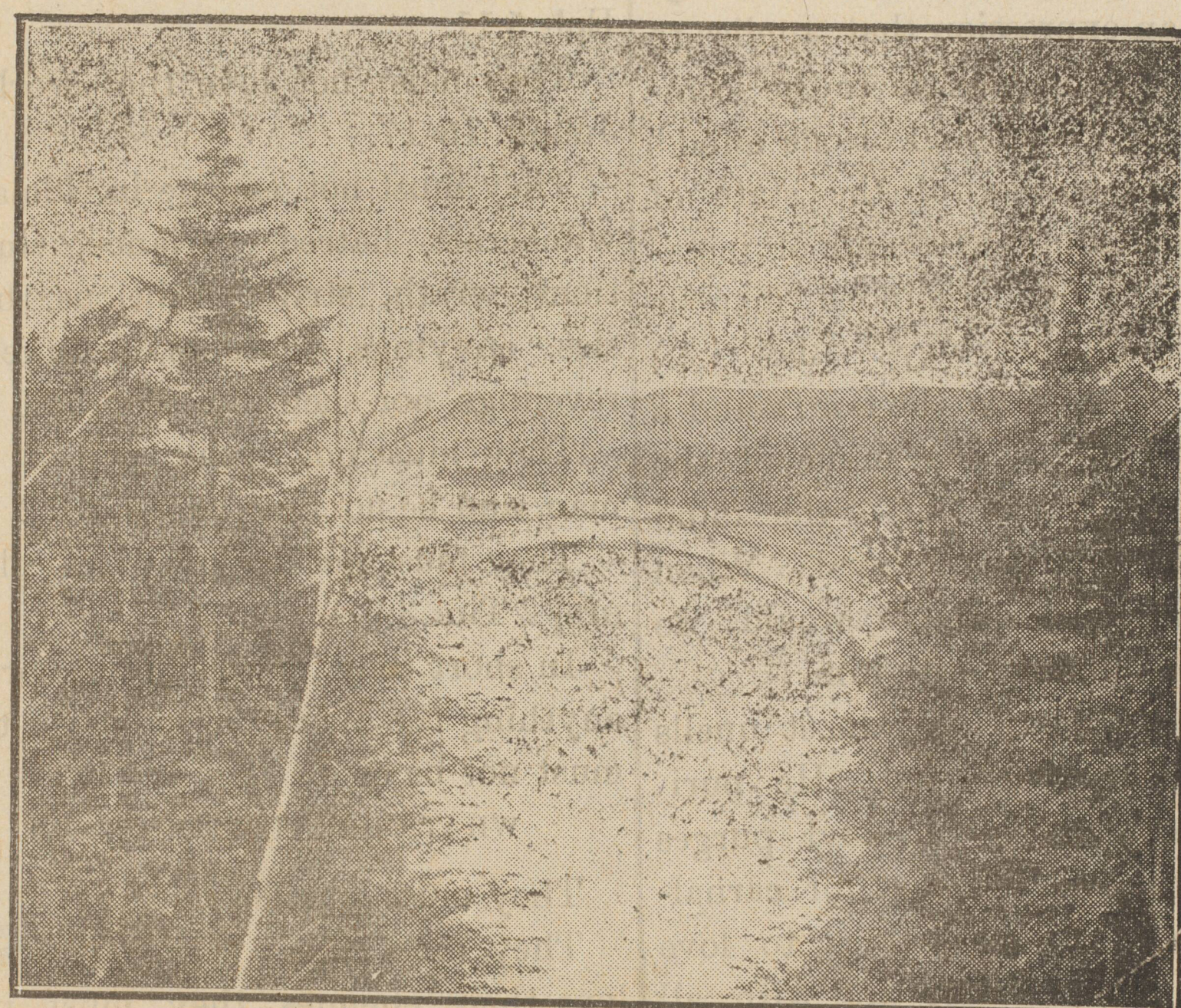
Rev W B Wiggins, B A, has decided to remain pastor of Moncton church.
