The Association not being a church, could not conscientiously take the prerogative to ordain a minister, hence the necessity for a church. I know I have undertaken a difficult task, when speak out thus boldly the true sentiment of my heart. I know I cross the views of many of my best holiness brethren; who are better qualified for this work than I. But brother; I have borne the load until I must unload. Four years ago, God laid this on my heart; but I felt my unworthyness, and tried to beg off; but as the days rolled by, and with them came letters from all over the south-west, inquiring about the holiness church. I can no longer shrink from the responsibility. I know it will bring severe criticism from many parts in holiness ranks, but my Lord will share the burden as he has done heretofore. I would have published these articles in some of the holiness papers in the south-west; but none of them are in sympathy with the Holiness church movement; hence I am driven to the necessity to put it in book form. If this little book has helped vou drop me a card of encouragement. If I am wrong write me a letter of correction; either of these will be appreciated.
