BEULAH CAMP GROUND.

The view given on the front page of this paper, shows the tabernacle, the new hotel and a few of the smaller cottages in that section of the ground. The picture while a good one and giving some idea of the changes and improvements made during the past few years, yet it does not in any way reveal the beauty of Beulah. The new hotel of which we only get a back view in the picture, and which faces on the beautiful artificial lake, thus adding much to the pleasantness of its location, is calculated in every way to furnish its guests with the best of entertainment. This building is 104x88 ft. with cellar under nearly the entire building. It is a two story building, having on the first floor, a large dining room, which will seat about 250 persons. Then comes the serving room with kitchen back of that. Then the supply store, where goods can be obtained at low prices; then there is the lunch room, the laundry, the barber shop, the press room where the "Beulah Daily News'' is printed, and which now is one of the indispensable things of Beulah Camp Ground.

Coming now to the front of the hotel we find on either side of the main entrance waiting rooms with wash and toilet rooms adjoining, for men and women respectively.—Then as we ascend the wide stairs and enter the large hall on the second floor, one is deeply impressed with the fact that the matter of space was not considered in the arrangement of this building, but all has been done with a view of contributing towards the convenience and happiness of those who may come to Beulah. On this floor there are twentyeight rooms, also bath and toilet rooms.

The hotel is managed by a committee of the Alliance who do all in their power to make their guests feel at home, and they certainly do not fail in this attempt.—Then beside this building, there is "River View Dormitory," a large two-storey building containing twenty eight rooms, also "Cedar Dale Dormitory" with over forty more. tages on the grounds, make it possible ness."
