PAULPIETERSBURG, Natal,
Dec 12, 1910.

Dear Boys and Girls:—I will tell you how I spent yesterday (Sunday). At seven o'clock, went to a kraal a short distance from here where I greatly enjoyed telling the people the simple story of the cross. There were three men, six women and four young people besides a number of children. They all sang heartily and said they were very glad I went, the head man saying we want you uku fika rejulo (to come every Sunday.)

Please unite with us in prayer that they will very soon accept Jesus for themselves.

Returned home about 9 o'clock then started with Lidia for another service, some six miles from here. To avoid some bad dongas we took a longer path making it necessary to ford one river three times, much to the discomfort of my donkey.

We went in such a zig-zag course that we were a long time getting there, found that the Christians misunderstanding about the appointment had come here by another path, but we gathered four old women, one very old man, three young people, also children and had a good meeting. It is such a pleasure to tell these poor souls of Jesus who can give them life and light and liberty. It is so sad to see those old people nearing the grave without any hope. After the service I went out to eat my lunch some children and the donkey sharing it with me.

We took a different path to return where we had to climb a high hill and cross some terrible dongas, an old man fell down one some time ago and got killed. We called at two kraals on our way back, at one all were away except one small baby asleep in a hut, at the other only some children were keeping house while their parents were away to a beer drink. We were tired enough when we arrived home, just before it began to rain heavy. Today it is real cool.

Quite a number of boys and girls have been here, small girls carrying babies on their backs. These children begin to work when young. The boys shepharding goats, going away with them in the morning, returning after sundown. They do not seem to have nice times for play as you in the home land, yet they appear happy as they do not know different.

Suppose you are all looking forward to Christmas with much pleasure. It doesn't seem like Christmas to us in Africa the weather being so warm, you see it is our summer.

The Lord bless you all is my prayer for you.

It showed us that we ought to keep on fire for God and let our light so shine that we could win other precious souls to Him. We also had a splendid service in the evening, it was a meeting of old time power, our Brother preached from Acts 16:23, 'Do thyself no harm,' and God did truly bless the message, an altar call was given and one sister professed conversion.

After having done his best to get souls to God, Bro Sanders gave an invitation for any one who wanted to get saved to remain after the meeting closed, and the husband of the sister mentioned above remained and we gathered around and prayed with him he said he felt better and promised he would live a better life in days to come. We praise our Heavenly Father for these souls and pray that they may be true to Him.

We were sorry that we could not continue the meetings but expect to have special services, God willing, in March. Will all the readers of the HIGHWAY remember us in prayer that we may see many sinners converted and believers sanctified wholly at Four Falls.
