Text Rev. 20.5.

This text clearly implies there are two "resurrections," and blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection; on such the second death hath no power; but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years," ver 6th. But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. This is the first "resurrection." This is the resurrection that the Apostle Paul sought to attain unto; the resurrection of the dead, ('from among the dead') (Phil 3rd ch.) This first resurrection is exclusively applied, to those who have fallen asleep in Jesus. Now is Christ risen from the dead, ("from among the dead") and become the first fruits of them that slept. (Christ the first fruits, afterward they that are Christ's at his coming"). This scripture alone should be sufficient to settle the question, that there will be a "resurrection" of the Saints at the return of our coming Lord, including all the Old Testament Saints referred to in Hebrews 12th, under the title of the spirits of just men made perefect. There is a doctrine being taught, a "theory" of a promiscuous resurrection, this is erroneous, doubtless, most of us at some time have held the opinion that all will rise together both
