LAYMEN'S MISSIONARY CONVENTION

The Laymen's Missionary Convention held at St. John, N. B., Nov. 20th, 22nd, was in every way a decided success. The number of delegates in attendance revealed the interest which is being taken in this work in this part of the country.

The Secretary reported that 645 laymen and 180 ministers had registered as delegates to the convention. The services were well attended, the interest being very great from the beginning to the end. Among the speakers were Sir Andrew Fraser of Scotland, who had spent 37 years as representative of the British Crown in India, and F. Campbell White of New York, who had spent 20 years in connection with the foreign work; as well as Bishop Richardson of Fredericton, and other noted christian workers from all parts of the Dominion. The following resolutions were passed by the convention.

- 1. The great need of the church is a stronger faith in prayer as the primary means of solving the missionary problem, and we urge that in every congregation there be definite measures undertaken to develop the prayer life in the individual, in the home and in public worship. 2. That the financial obligation of a church is best expressed not in large sums given by a few but in offerings from all the congregation as the Lord hath prospered them. 3. That this offering should be made a part of the worship each Lord's day. 4. There should be in every congregation at least one mission study group of men and once a month, if possible, a general missionary meeting for all. 5. There should be in every congregation, the minister being the leader, a men's missionary committee who should co-operate with him in emphasizing mission study and in conducting an every members canvass for missionary offerings at least once a year. 6. In view of the great opportunity for advance we believe that the offerings for 1912 should exceed those of 1911 by at least thirty-three and a third per cent. Finally, it is clearly the duty of the men gathered in this convention to im-

NATIVE WORKERS IN AFRICA.

Some have intimated to Dr. Sanders that they would like to support a "Native Worker in Africa." Now if any person wishes to do this there is no reason why they cannot, for they can support just as many as they wish. All that will be needful for them to do, is to send their money to Rev. H. C. Archer, Woodstock, N. B., who is our "Missionary Treasurer," and their money will be sent direct to the mission field and applied just as they wish it to be.

The reason that we want the money to go through our treasurer's hands is, first, because we want our missionary work done with some regularity; second, because in the past several persons have undertaken to support a native worker, and have paid one or two payments, and because of some change taking place with them, they have ceased to pay, and the worker was left without support. So now we have found, that in order that the Native Workers can continue their work without interruption, they must be paid through our treasurer. We will gladly employ as many Native Workers as persons wish to support at \$60.00 per year. The amount can be paid quarterly if desired.
