We apprehend that the Clergy Reserve Bill as it passed the House of Commons, and proba bly has before this become law, will not afford the satisfaction that is so desirable; as it gives an undue preference to two denominations of christians, in a colony where it has been admitted on all hands, there should be a perfect equa-

By the Bill as we understand Lord John Russell's statement, the proceeds of one-fourth of the Clergy Reserves already sold, are to be given passengers can be landed from, or put on board to the Churches of England and Scotland, in proportions of two to one ;-oue-half of the re-maining three-fourths is to be appropriated to Char those churches in the same proportions: not from any superiority of the former church, but because the number of members of the church of England in Upper Canada is estimated at 80, 000, and those of the sister church at 40,000.-The remaining half of the three-fourths is " to be left to the disposal of the Governor and Exe-cutive Council of Canada, generally for the pur-poses of religious instruction and worship." In In this manner, five-eighths of those reserves are to be given to two churches, the united num. ber of whose members, do not amount to more than one-fourth of the population of the colony. shafts complete, nearly new.

Such an appropriation we repeat cannot give satisfaction. It will doubtless occupy the attention of the United Assembly at an early day; and the Imperial Legislature will be called up-on, to adopt a more equitable arrangement; or what will prove more beneficial, to appropriate the entire proceeds of those reserves "general-ly for the purposes of religious instruction and worship."
