The Regiment was drawn up in line fronting the River and the firing party which consisted of the 18 best shots in the corps was drawn up in front of the line, and provided with three rounds each;—The target was placed at the distance of 120 yards on which was painted a figure representing a foreign General Officer of rank, and which was made a complete riddle.

The most exciting part of the scene was the firing off between the victorious party and a young recruit who had placed an equal number of balls through the centre of the tar-

dal for his meritorious conduct while in the Regiment.

Colonel,—on presenting the medals he gave the Regt. one of his most animating addresses, which we are sorry want of room prevents us giving in our columns to-day.
