

made to justify the slander complained of.—Mr. STREET himself, or we certainly understood him, said he did not mean to justify the publication with reference to the Lieut. Governor, and Mr. HAZEN in his address to the Jury, declared that had it not been for the notice bestowed upon the article by the Legislature, it would have sunk into the contempt it merited. The entire defence in fact, was an attempt to do away with the gravamen of the charge,—to deny the publication of the libel,—or to misrepresent its meaning; and all these causes operating upon our mind when writing, led us to make the remark we did, but which it would seem was an incorrect one: an error however, into which if we mistake not, the perusal of the trial will induce others very generally to fall; and therefore do not hesitate to insert Mr. STREET'S declaration, that the Counsel for the defence never meant to admit "the publication or alleged libel to be unjustifiable or unfounded."
