

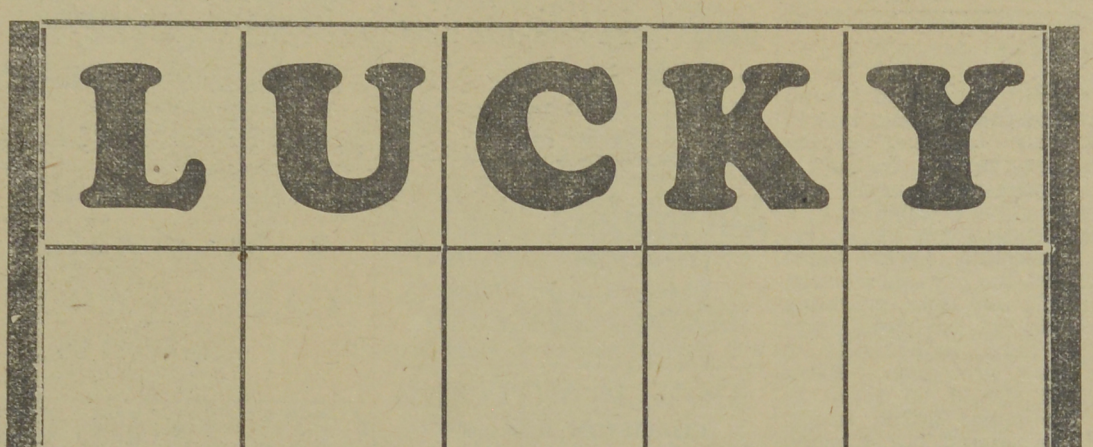

MORE WHEAT PROBLEMS
The war has been responsible for many things, not the least is the effort put forth by previously large wheat importing countries to be self-sufficient. Sweden is the latest recruit. Before the war Sweden, states the Agricultural Department of the Canadian National Railways, found it necessary to import wheat, the wheat crop seldom reaching 250,000 tons and imports averaged 350,000 tons annually. Sweden's wheat crop for 1932 yielded 720,000 tons and imports amounted to 170,000 tons and there was, consequently, a carry-over into 1933 of approximately 130,000 tons.

THE NEWS ON REVIEW

A loan of \$1,000,000 for relief purposes has been secured by Alberta from the Dominion Government, it was announced by Hon. R. G. Reid, Alberta treasurer.

A Japanese plan to restore the "Boy Emperor", Henry Pu-Yi, to the throne of his Manchu ancestors in Manchoukuo, was believed by Chinese authorities to be progressing rapidly in Mukden.

The Japanese Government, expressing fear that Japanese products are to be excluded from European and British Empire markets, was preparing last week to ask the Diet for power to make tariff reprisals by executive decree.

All basic rates will be subjected to a small general percentage increase as a result of the agreement of the North Atlantic shipping conference, it was learned authoritatively. This change will be made, it was understood, after slight adjustments in the relationship of some ships to others.

The result is expected to change rates but slightly from the present schedule. The changes are embodied in an agreement reached recently by the conference, details of which will be announced December 23.

November trade figures for Great Britain, issued last Tuesday, showed further gains. Exports totalled 38,054,000 against 35,154,000 in November of last year, and increase of 2,900,000. This came on top of increases for several successive months.

Recovery of at least some of the German colonies lost under the Treaty of Versailles at the end of the war is being pursued with increasing energy by the Nazi regime, under whose auspices a large mass meeting was held.

Canadians shivered last week as wintry blasts and biting cold swept the Dominion from the Rockies to the Maritimes. In most parts of the Dominion low temperatures held sway, with

A deficit of 2,974,000,000 lire (currently about \$237,920,000) in the 1934-35 budget has been approved by the Italian Council of Ministers. Total expenses were estimated at 20,636,000,000 lire (\$1,650,880,000) compared to estimated receipts of 17,662,000,000 lire (about \$1,412,960,000).

Winnipeg's community chest campaign has attained its objective of \$345,000, it was officially announced. The amount cannot be stated exactly as subscriptions are still filtering in. It was also announced 96 per cent. of pledges in last year's chest campaign had been redeemed.

Charging mental cruelty, indifference and neglect, Mary Pickford, Toronto film actress, has filed a suit for divorce from Douglas Fairbanks, motion picture actor, who is in England. Filing of the action confirmed reports of a permanent separation and set at rest numerous rumors of a reconciliation.

sociation of all nations broadly dedicated to promote international peace has been broached by a meeting of high officials, it was learned.

Unrest has developed in Outer Mongolia, with Nationalists rising against the Soviet's nine-year domination of the regime, say Japanese military reports.

Prices of coal in Quebec were fixed and proper competition was prevented, Mr. Justice Wilfrid Laliberte found on Tuesday in a judgment convicting five coal companies of combining in restraint of trade. Fines totalling \$30,000 were imposed, and costs were assessed in proportion to the size of the respective penalties. Defence counsel gave immediate notice of an appeal.
