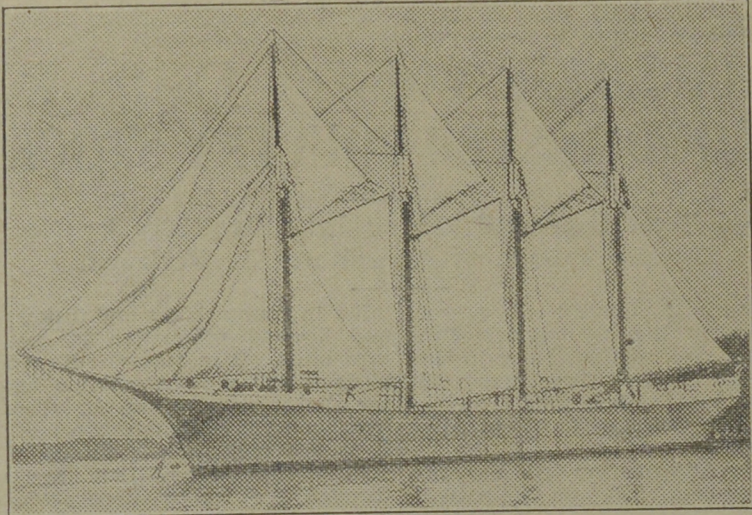

THE GREATER SAINT JOHN

Sometimes in Saint John there is talk of the city and parts of the county uniting, but the people in the parishes appear in opposition to the project and so the ideas of a Greater Saint John go slipping. But there appears to be possibilities in the plans for uniting the city and county. Under present conditions a large percentage of the money spent by the municipal council is collected by the city. The finances of the two are interlocked to a certain extent and two organizations are necessary to collect and disburse them.

Here comes the suggestion that the financial departments of the city and county be amalgamated and operated under the county. The county or municipal council has among its members the members of the city common council. Under those conditions the finances could be run fairly well by the municipal body. The funds could easily be ear-marked for city or county as collected but bonds could be floated in the name of the whole county, which would then include the city.

The reason this suggestion is made is that the people in the parishes of Lancaster and Beaconsfield and parts of Simonds, express their fear of taxation if united with the city. So why not turn the thing around and make the city a part of the county so far as taxation and finances are concerned. There could be economy effected in the matter of officials. There are many desirable ideas in this connection one of which would be the elimination of disputes over schools.

The situation in Philadelphia is somewhat similar to that in Saint John and in the Pennsylvania city there has been some move toward having closer co-operation between the city and county. Philadelphia shares with many others an unfortunate set-up that makes for waste and extravagance and prevents the application of sundry obvious economies. The city of Philadelphia and the county of Philadelphia are co-extensive. The city has power to control its finances, but not, excepting in a limited way, those of the county.

Some time ago, a committee, which included several outstanding Philadelphia bankers recommended that these two independent authorities be consolidated, and that the twin budgets be rolled into one. Local politicians blocked the substitution of one budget and one payroll for twin budgets and twin payrolls, with the coincident abolition of superfluous or overlapping jobs.
