Another feature of this latter period is that Canada's visible and favorable trade balance against the world was slightly over \$80,-000,000, an increase of \$20,000,000. *

A new wheat king was crowned at the hay and grain show held with the International Livestock Exposition—and again the coveted crown of the North American grain kingdom rested on the brow of a Canadian—John B. Allsop, of Wembley, Alta. His victory gave to the Dominion's wheat growers their twelfth wheat championship since 1919. The reserve champion— the prince of wheat—was L. E. Peterson, of Victor, Montana.
