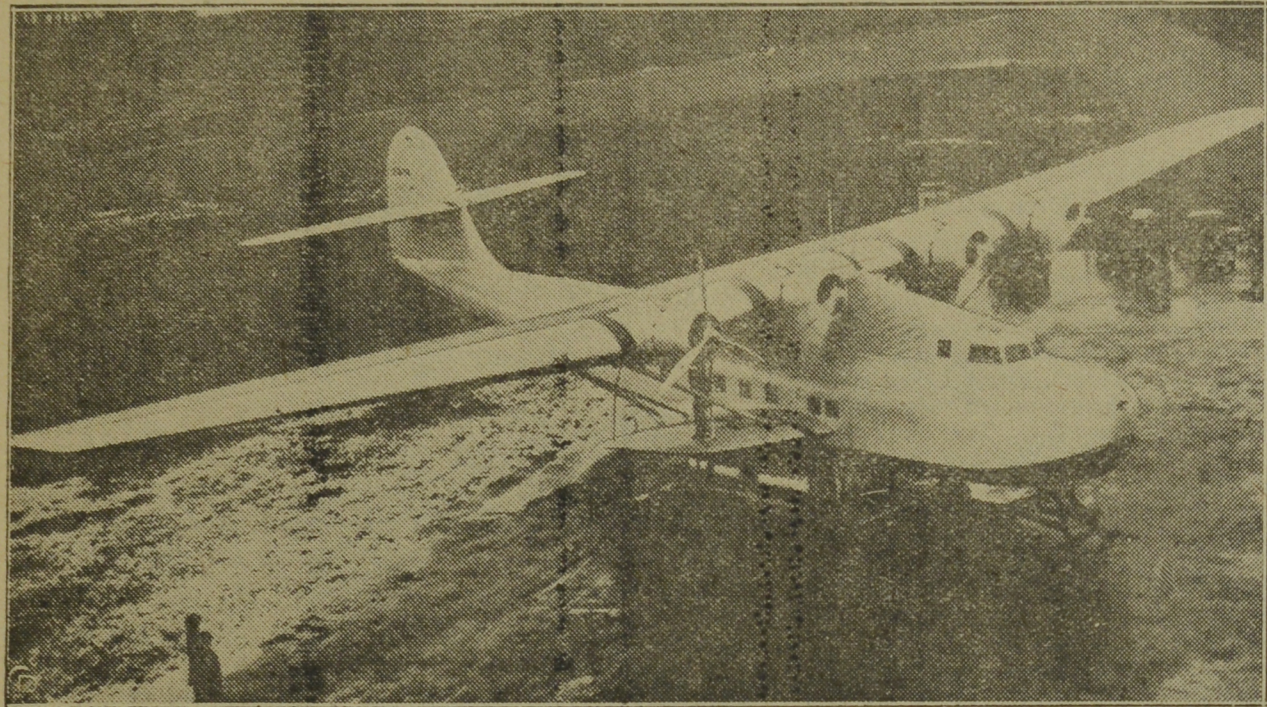


SECRET OF "WORLD'S LARGEST LINER" MADE PUBLIC



Its construction guarded with the greatest secrecy over a period of two years, the giant flying clipper No. 5, said to be the world's largest air liner, has at last been shown. It was revealed for the first time to a small group of aviation executives and experts at Baltimore. No. 5 was built for trans-Pacific use by the Pan-American Airways.

It is a gleaming giant of chrome metal, measuring 90 feet in length, and 24 feet high, and it has a wing span of 130 feet. It weighs 23,100 pounds, empty. It will take the air, with its full crew, fifty passengers, and a capacity load of freight, weighing 51,000 pounds.

The News On Review

The government decree banning circulation in Austria of all German newspapers has been extended for another three months after the date of its expiration December 12.

The season for commercial fishing in Lake Erie has been extended until December 25, according to an order-in-Council. Permits ordinarily expire on December 10, but, due to the fact that the fishing authorities in the States, on the other side of the lake, have extended their seasons, Ontario is doing likewise.

Sentence of four years in the penitentiary was pronounced upon Edward Dansereau, former chief of the permit department of the Quebec Liquor Commission, after he pleaded guilty before Judge Fred T. Enright to a charge of stealing \$19,503 from the commission.

The case was settled out of court when the dealer paid a fine of \$3. The section of the act under which the prosecution was made reads: "No person shall sell any radio receiving set to any person for installation or opera-

tion until the purchaser has produced for inspection of the vendor his private radio receiving license."

Authorization for a "refresher course" at the 21 highway first-aid posts established between Toronto and Montreal has been given at a meeting of the ambulance committee of the St. John Ambulance Association at Ottawa. Courses will be given at each post, it was decided. The meeting followed a luncheon gathering of the commandery council of St. John Ambulance Association, attended by officers of the association from Montreal, Toronto, Saint John and Ottawa.

Kitchener's (Ont.) relief strike has ended and pickets of the unemployed on relief works have been withdrawn. Chairman Eby of the family relief board, said. More men are now available for relief jobs than are required.

A. H. Boddy, K.C., acting for the Dominion Department of Marine, has revealed that a Brantford radio dealer had been fined under the Radio Telegraph Act for selling a receiving set to a man without first requiring the purchaser to show a radio license. Mr. Boddy said it was the first prosecution of its kind in Canada.

Synthetic silken yarn from southern pine trees—the first ever made—was shown at New York last week with announcement of the discovery of a process through which the pine forests of the United States south can be made into cloth. The making of artificial yarns from southern pine has been a goal of chemists and a commercial dream for years. The supply in southern forests is inexhaustible. Eager efforts were made to tap this cellulose source because it was expected to be more economical, and the announcement quotes basic material cost prices half of those of the current markets.

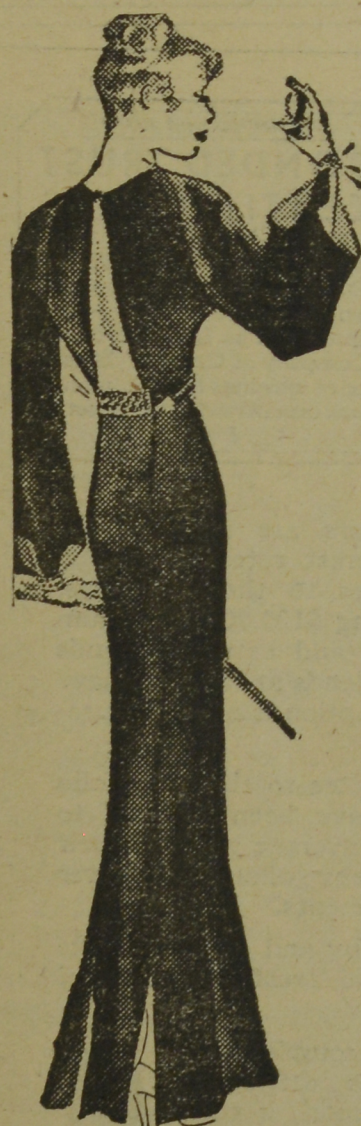
MORE BABIES IN ENGLAND AND WALES

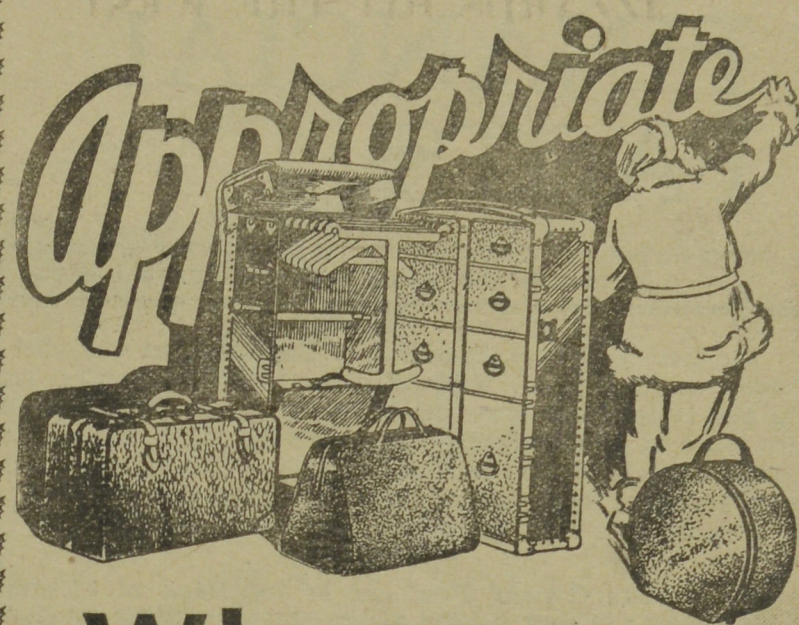

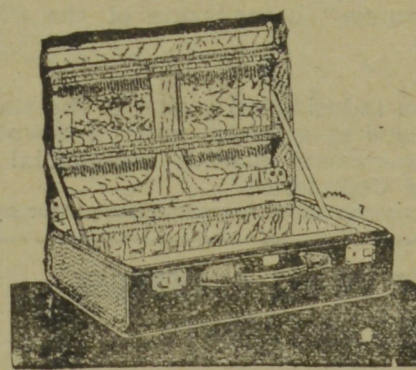

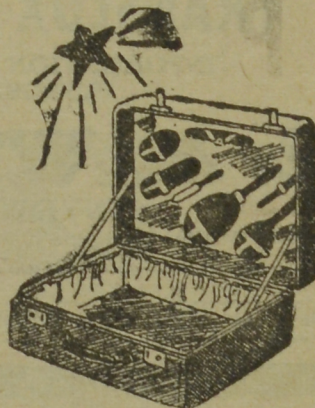
