Old and new entertainers will share honors on the Corn Cob Pipe Club program, to be heard over station WEAF at 11.00 p.m. on Wednesday by mixing a series of imitations with the old time tunes that have long been a feature of the broadcasts. Little Marjorie, whose appearances on the programs are infrequent these days, will be back with a new juvenile number. A newcomer to the program who, curiously enough, has been nicknamed "Stupid," will be heard in his series of imitations, and Buck Bannister will be on hand with his barnyard noises to open and close the program. For music, the Crossroads Symphony promises such favorites as "Coming Round the Mountain," "Little Liza Jane" and "Somebody Stole My Girl." There will be more group singing, this time of "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" and a bass solo with "Leven Cent Cotton" as the tune.
