- Steam navigation between Saint John and Digby started—1827.
- Court House, Saint John, built—1828.
- Corner stone of King's College, Fredericton, laid by Sir Howard Douglass—September 15, 1828.
- Government House, Fredericton, completed—December 8, 1828.
- Beacon, Saint John harbour, built—1829.
- Saint John Water Co. and Board of Health established—1832.
- First visit of cholera in Saint John, fifty deaths October 7 to November 6—1834.
- First lunatic asylum in Canada opened on corner Leinster and Wentworth Streets, Saint John—November 14, 1835.
- New Church of England burial ground consecrated—September 14, 1835.
- Steamer Royal Tar with menagerie, burned in Penobscot Bay, enroute to Saint John—October 20, 1826.
- Big Fire on South Market Wharf, Ward and Water Streets, loss \$1,000,000, about one-third of city—January 14, 1837.
- Accession of Queen Victoria—June 20, 1837.
- First bridge over Reversing Falls, Saint John, fell and seven men killed—August 8, 1837.
- First penny paper published, "British Empire," tri-weekly, was issued by George E. Fenety, Saint John—1838.
- Coronation of Queen Victoria—June 20, 1838.
- Coronation of Queen Victoria festivities and ball, Saint John—October 20, 1838.
- Commercial Bank, corner Prince William and Princess Streets, Saint John, built—1838.
- Fire at Saint John, consuming 125 buildings, principally stores and warehouses in the vicinity of Water Street and South Wharf. Loss \$1,200,000—August 17, 1839.
- First ferry steamer to Carleton, "Victoria,"—September 5, 1839.
- Brick Market House, Market Square, Saint John, opened—December 23, 1839.
- Queen Victoria married to Prince Albert—February 18, 1840.
- Mechanic's Institute opened at Saint John—November, 1840.

"I said Shakespeare, not Dickens," said the entertainer with dignity.

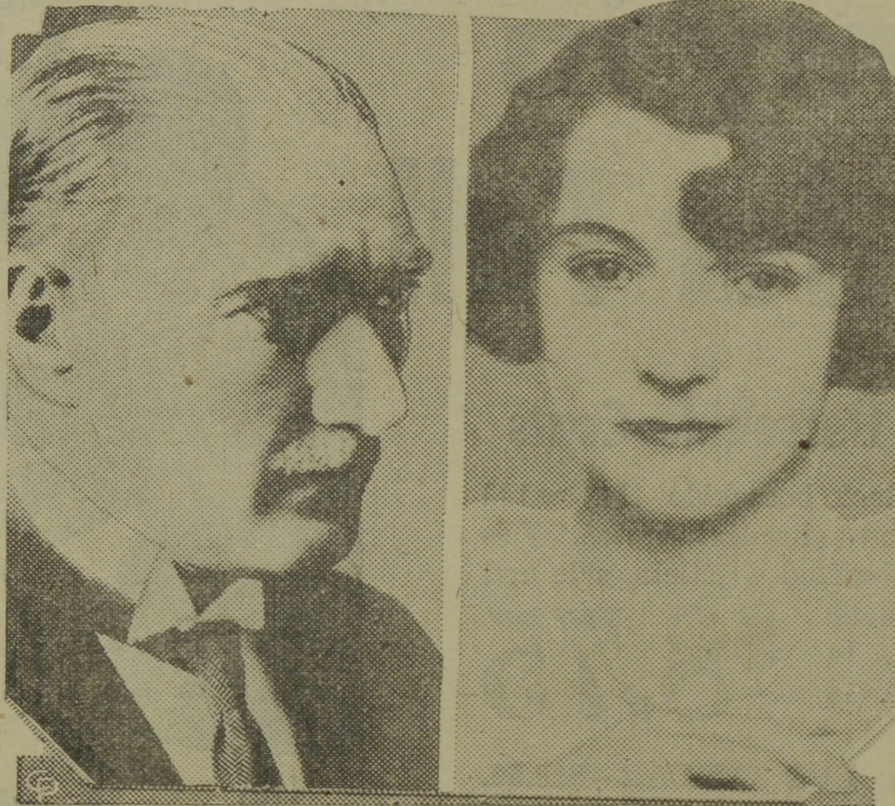

Around the Maritimes

There are 127 retail stores selling Annapolis Valley apples in Halifax. This was the answer to a complaint that Annapolis Valley apples could not be obtained in Halifax.

Mrs. Mary Fielding, Truro, charged with assaulting and causing actual bodily harm to two-year-old Buddy Dewey, was acquitted last week by a jury of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia.

No further clue was received as to the fate of the storm-battered freighter Millpool, unreported since her feverish SOS calls were heard on the North Atlantic last week. She was bound from Danzig to Montreal with grain.

The Silver Tip Fox Biscuit plant at Moncton, which was destroyed by fire last week, will be rebuilt, it is announced. Work will commence at once and it is hoped to have the exterior completed within three weeks so that business will be resumed as soon as possible.

A gathering of fire chiefs and fire department officials of the Stephen district, which includes parts of New Brunswick and Maine, was held at St. Stephen last Monday in connection with Fire Prevention Week.

Prince Edward Island fishermen are looking for small catches of oysters this year, owing, it is said, to severe ice and frost conditions last winter. There is an active demand for the product, with more buyers in the market than in previous years, and the prices being paid to the fishermen at present are \$3 to \$3.50 per barrel.

Farmers in the Digby section of Nova Scotia are planting winter rye in order to have a supply of feed for their stock early next spring. It is pointed out that this crop will provide green feed much earlier than any other, and the green feed so provided will take the place of hay for work horses and oxen.

The announcement that the Government of New Brunswick renewed the tri-party agreement among the dominion and provincial governments and any municipality wishing to take advantage under the same, with reference to settlement on crown lands from any municipality, incorporated town or city, of unemployed residents who wished to go on the land, was made last week following a meeting of the government.

quiring two whole years to bring it to completion. It will be 1936 before she is ready for her maiden voyage, and when completed she will house a population of more than 4,000 people. More than 100,000 square feet of specially treated, non-inflammable, linoleum and about 80,000 square feet of carpet will be required for covering the floors. Over 14,000 electric light fittings will be needed. There will be three separate generating plants—one for light, one for power, and a spare in case of breakdown. A duplicate supply of 14,000 lighting bulbs will be carried, ensuring a duplicate for every light on board. The electrical plant alone, it is estimated, will cost about \$450,000. The ship will have its own flower gar-

dens. A staff of gardeners will be carried so that fresh blooms will decorate the tables every day. In addition to the table decorations there will be 5,000 potted plants and over 1,000 vases of flowers always on display. Some idea of the dishes necessary may be had when they will carry 45,000 plates, 15,000 cups, and an equal number of saucers for every day use apart from the enormous reserve store needed to replace breakages; 3,000 tea pots, while 14,000 glasses will be carried for use in emergency. On this ship there are more than 1,000 cabins, with their private bathrooms attached, necessitating six professional plumbers under a special officer to attend to these fittings on each voyage. These bathrooms alone will cost nearly \$1,000,000. While masts and spars are not conspicuous on this huge liner, it will need over 200 miles of wire rope.

Even the children are lavishly looked after. More than \$200,000 will be spent in providing nurseries, play-rooms, which will have for the children's pleasure and amusement over \$15,000 worth of toys. A laundry fitted

with every possible modern device will be installed at a cost of \$100,000, capable of washing, drying, and ironing 25,000 separate articles every twenty-four hours. There will be a complete hospital capable of treating any case of illness as efficiently as the most up-to-date establishment on land. There will also be a dental surgery. Provision is made for two complete theatres, with dressing room, stage, etc. A circulating library will have a stock of over 10,000 books. It is estimated that over \$35,000,000 will be spent on this great ship before she goes to sea for the first time.
