When the Queen Mary was launched by the Queen, it marked the end of the reign of the Mauretania as Britain's crack liner afloat. And the "old lady of the Atlantic," who has ruled for twenty-seven years, is to be withdrawn from the transatlantic service. It is possible that she will be converted into a cruising vessel, and her popularity among holiday makers is assured.

No ship in the world has ever held the popularity of sailors and the public in the way that the Mauretania has during her three million miles of sea life.

Yet by neat steering, the liner's captain avoided all of them. As the ship was armed, the crew prepared to open fire, so the U-boat fled!

GARBAGE DISPOSAL

THE NEED of an incinerator for Saint John is more evident every day. Up to the present practically all the garbage of the city has been placed on dumps. But this method of disposal has become obsolete. As a matter of fact the public dumps have become a menace to the health of the community and some sanitary means of disposal of garbage is necessary.

During the last few years the dumps have given the city departments much extra work and created extra expense. Hordes of rats and other vermin have been bred in the dumps and residences in the vicinity have been overrun with these pests. The city has had to bear the expense of cleaning some of the residences, but practically all dumps have been closed, excepting that at the foot of Sydney Street and the Harbor Commission is making strenuous objection to materials dumped there being washed into the harbor.

One of the old lime kilns at Pokiok has been fitted up by private enterprise for the burning of garbage, but it is said that this can hardly handle all the wet garbage, which amounts to some fifty tons a day.

Something must be done to handle the garbage and other refuse materials. Investigation of the Pokiok kiln idea is being made and something may be done there. However, it is believed that something on a larger scale is necessary for Saint John and the city fathers should lose no time in coming to a decision on the matter. They must consider all the facts and either build a new incinerator or make use of the lime kiln.
