> The constitution is as follows: The Commission shall be known

Objects

Fostering the promotion of all and any form of competitive sports or athletics for Saint John schoolboys, so that the physical and athletic development of the schoolboys may be cultivated, sustained and protected. It is not the object of this commission to capitalize on the athletic ability of the boys, but to provide skills or wish of this commission to inpetition in any way, but to assist and protect them from interference by any outside individuals or organizations. (Interscholastic sports being under the jurisdiction of the M.P.B. of A.A.U. of C. would not come under this organization.)

Duties

(a) To have oversight of all schoolboy athletic activities in the city of Saint John. (b) All schoolboy champion-

ship meets in any form or class of athletics must have the approval and sanction of this commission. Otherwise any claim to city school championship will not obtain or be in any way considered. The applications for sanctions must be made in writing signed by two members of the organization applying for sanction.


