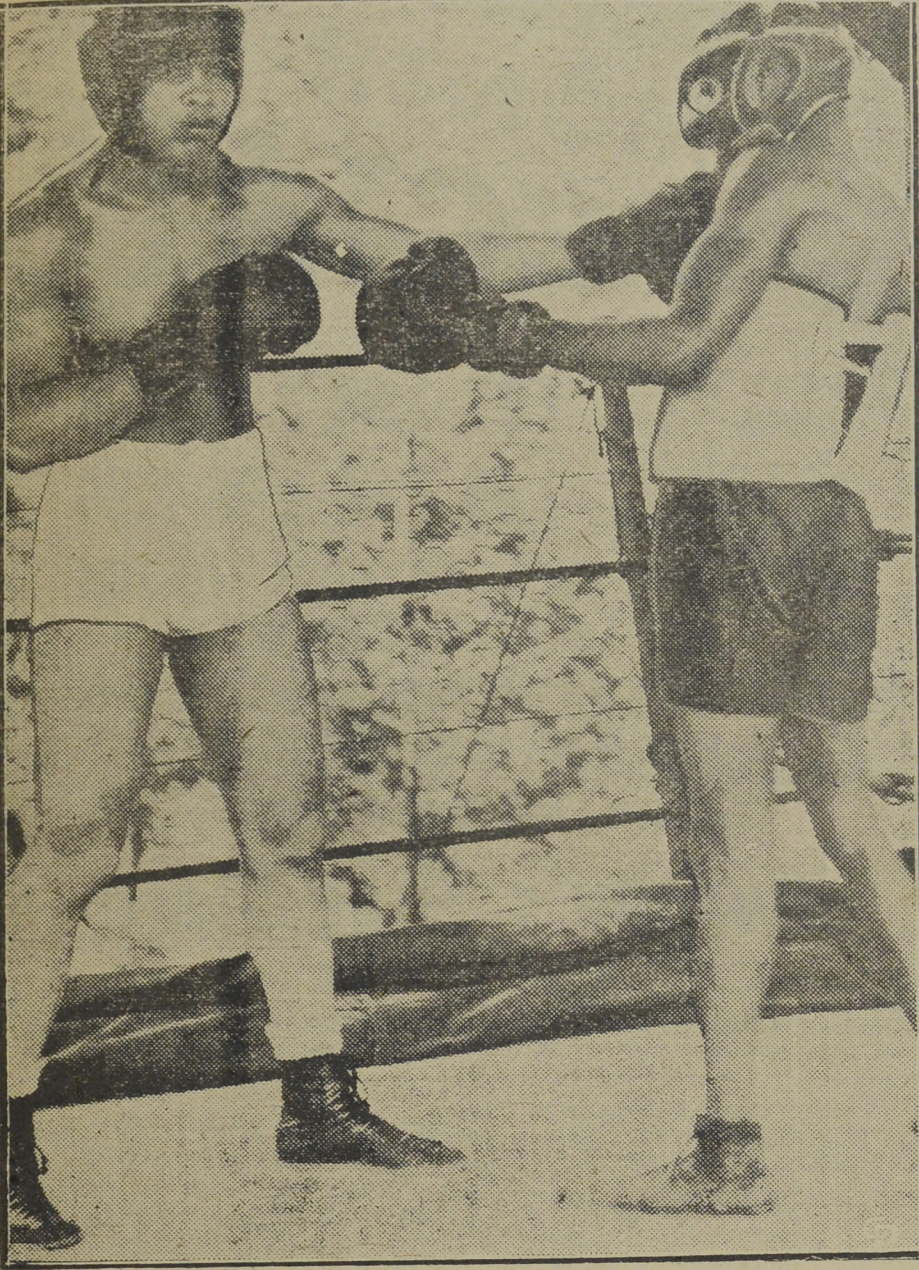


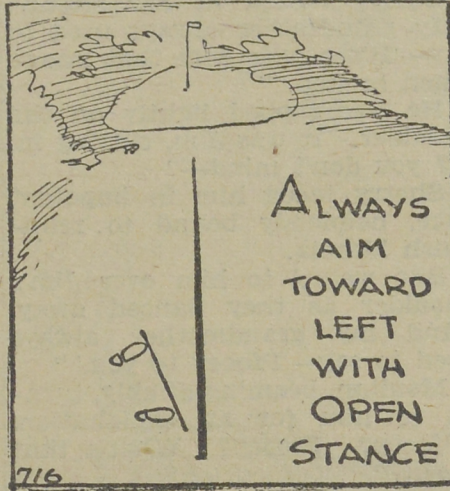
THE "BROWN BOMBER" WINS

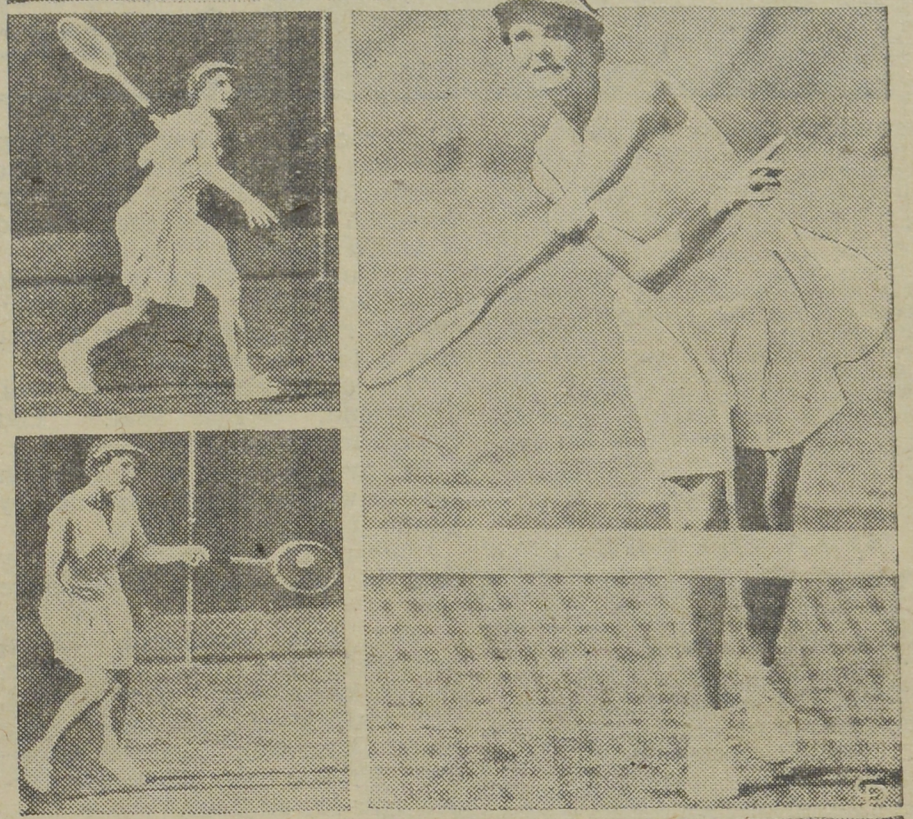
Some people claim that all things go in pairs, others that they go in three. This is particularly true in golf.

I often suggest an open stance to players, that is to place the feet so that the right foot is advanced. Many will try this stance but few will use it properly.

It is not enough to stand with the right foot advanced. You must also have your toes in a line that would point at least 15 degrees to the left of your objective. Only by this aiming toward the left can you get the full benefit from this placement of the feet.

This alignment should be followed with all shots.

Kay Stammers Will Be Tennis Queen Says Perry

Boston.—Fred Perry, greatest amateur tennis player in the world, believes that one day soon Kay Stammers from his native England will occupy the throne next to his as "Queen of the tennis world."

However, Perry was not alone in this prediction. It is the universal opinion that Miss Stammers, a port-sider, with two important victories over Mrs. Helen Wills Moody and Miss Helen Jacobs, America's greatest, is the coming star.

Miss Stammers is the English women's hard court champion, and with Freda James as a partner, won the doubles titles in France, Spain, and was victorious in the championship tourney of the world at Wimbledon. However, they met defeat in the United States women's doubles championships at Brookline.

Is Fast Improving

Her latest impressive victory was over Miss Jacobs in the Wightman cup matches in New York City after a hard-fought three-set batch. It was a decided upset and raised British hopes of winning the cup, which were dashed, however, in succeeding matches.

Miss Stammers has made but two trips to the United States. It was the noticeable improvement in her game since her last visit two years ago that caused the ex-

perts to sit up and take notice. She has developed a fine assortment of strokes, chief of which is a powerful left-handed forehand drive, which observers claim is the fastest of any woman in the game today.

Back of all these is that will to win and the great courage of the English miss, who has been in the shadow of defeat several times in principal matches only to pull through to victory.

Miss Stammers is still a young girl and with her game continually improving, is on the threshold of the unbeatables.

HOCKEY IN ENGLAND

Two new rinks are being built in London, one at Brighton, and several existing rinks are to be enlarged to take care of the growing interest in ice hockey in England, according to F. J. Gemmill Smith in the September issue of the Canadian National Railways Magazine. At the new rink to be constructed on the site of the old Earls Court Exhibition there will be two teams, one drawn from players of the Toronto district and the other from McGill University, Yale and Harvard students, overseas players in His Majesty's forces and certain home talent. The Earls Court arena will be the biggest of its kind in Europe with 15,000 moveable seats in tiers of 300 and 12 acres of floor space.
