ALLEGED IRREGULARITIES

THE NEW Brunswick Government has authorized Peter J. Hughes, K.C., to investigate and report upon activities of certain officials of the Department of Public Works in Restigouche County prior to July 15, 1935. According to the announcement the Government is to attempt to get back from some officials money which, it is said, was taken from the Province unlawfully. The alleged irregularities included adding names to the payroll when person was not employed; allowing workers more time than actually worked; adding to payroll names of children who did not work; allowing children men's wages, etc.

It is hoped that the amounts rebated will cover the costs of the enquiry, but in the meantime the Government should see that no similar practices are being carried on under the present administration. It is to be hoped that children will not be employed at men's wages because of their political party affiliations when unemployed men not favorable to the present Gov-ernment are left idle. It is hoped also that the road supervisors will not be permitted to draw pay for their own equipment and horses when men who have other political views are barred from any sort of employment. In other words, it is the hope of the people of the Province that while the Government is having an investigation made into alleged irregularities of another administration that similar irregularities are not being carried on.
