Colonel Brooks Declares Affidavit Read By Walter W. V. Foster At Nomination Proceedings To Be False

At the nomination proceedings held at Hampton. Kings County, N. B., on June 20th, Walter W. V. Foster, Opposition candidate in Kings County, said he would read a copy of an Affidavit but would not state the name of the party making it, nor the name of the Justice before whom it was sworn, and said he had promised not to disclose these. In response to the demand of the meeting that the names be given, he did at last disclose them. Below will be found the solemn declaration of Colonel Brooks in answer to the copy of Affidavit read by Walter W. V. Foster:-

I, Alfred J. Brooks of the Town of Sussex in the County of Kings in the Province of New Brunswick, Barrister-at-Law, do solemnly declare:

1. That I have read a copy of an Affidavit made by one John Middleton of the Town of Sussex aforesaid, Labourer, purporting to be sworn at the Town of Sussex on the 18th day of June, A.D. 1935, before Frank Howard, a Justice of the Peace in and for the County of Kings, which said copy of Affidavit was read at the Nomination Proceedings at the Court House in the Village of Hampton in the County of Kings on Thursday, the 20th day of June, A.D. 1935, by Walter W. V. Foster, Candidate for Election to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, which said copy of Affidavit reads as follows:

"I, John Middleton, of the Town of Sussex, Labourer, make oath "and say as follows: That in the last week of May, 1935, I called "at the office of Colonel A. J. Brooks, Member Provincial Legislature of New Brunswick and asked him for work on the permanent pavement to which he stated I will give you a job on the pavement if you will sign this paper and he produced the paper for me to sign and I read the paper and then said to him, that if "I sign this paper I will have to vote fo. you and to which Mr. "Brooks replied, then you would sooner loaf than sign the paper and I replied I would not vote for him and Mr. Brooks then said, "all right, you cannot get a job."

and I do solemnly declare that I did not ask the said John Middleton or any other person whomsoever, either in the month of May, 1935, or at any other time, to sign any paper that he or any other person would vote for me or any other Candidate or Candidates for election.

2. That I never prepared nor did any one elese with my knowledge or consent, prepare a paper or document containing any promise to vote for me or any other Candidate or Candidates for election, and I never had such a paper in my office

3. That I never said to the said John Middleton "then you would sooner loaf than sign the paper," or other words to

4. That as soon as the said Walter W. V. Foster had read the said copy of Affidavit, I immediately denied the statements contained therein and publicly declared that the said Affidavit was false and untrue.
