It is one of the group of three transports which will operate in connection with the Fundy Motor Line, Ltd., from Calais to Bangor and Boston.

With a capacity of 37 passengers, the "air glide" bus is fashioned along the lines of the Union Pacific Railway's "Zephyr." The bus attracted much attention in Saint John.
