

## Modern Transport Makes A Visit To City of Saint John

### Air Glide Bus Connects With Fundy Motor Lines.

A visitor which attracted much attention in Saint John this week was one of the new Grey Line "air glide" busses. It arrived from Bangor, Me., with officials of the line. It is one of the group of three transports which will operate in connection with the Fundy Motor Line, Ltd., from Calais to Bangor and Boston.

With a capacity of 37 passengers, the "air glide" bus is fashioned along the lines of the Union Pacific Railway's "Zephyr." The bus attracted much attention in Saint John. It has a maximum speed of 90 miles an hour and weighs 11 tons. In Canada it is valued at \$37,000. It has modern fixtures, including adjustable chairs for sleeping purposes.

Grey Line transports carry the name "Saint John" along with others on all busses and thus this city is advertised throughout the Eastern States.

C. V. Emerson, managing director of the Fundy Motor Lines, came from St. Stephen in the new bus along with officials of the Grey Line.

### Decision Will Follow Action of Sunny Brae re the Same Matter.

Matters relative to the proposal to pave Church Street extension from Mountain Road to Hall's Creek Bridge, were discussed at a meeting of the whole council held in the Mayor's office last week. No action was taken in the matter pending the decision of the Sunny Brae Town Council who are considering the construction of a hard-surface road from Hall's Creek Bridge to the entrance of Elmwood cemetery. It was decided that upon receipt of information as to the plans of the Sunny Brae councillors, the Board of Works Committee would sit in special session and draft a resolution which they will present before a regular meeting of the City Council.

### FIND RADIUM IN SOVIET

Baku, U.S.S.R.—Radium, one of the rarest and most costly of minerals, has been found near Elendorf in the Narimanov region of Azerbeidjan. Still other deposits were discovered in Kurdistan. 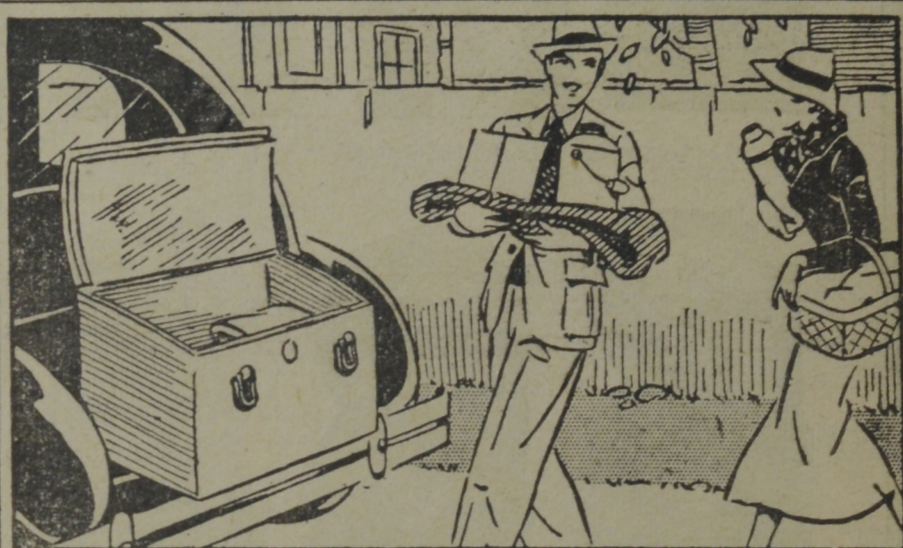
