A total of 81 boxes of triplets were boarded, all of which sold for 111/2 cents per pound, or onequarter of a cent higher than prevailed at the first meeting last

The factories boarding cheese were Cornhill, 31 boxes; Head of Millstream, 10 boxes, and Knightville, 40 boxes. Subsequent meetings will be held in the Board of Trade rooms, Saint John, comcencing June 12 and fortnightly thereafter, at 2.15 p.m.
