International Rule Give Halibut Catch A Decided Increase

Average Pacific Haul Per Unit Has Jumped Sharply Under Joint Control of Waters.

Regulation of the North Pacific halibut fishery under a treaty made a few years ago between Canada and the United States has already han the effect of increasing the average catch per unit of fishing gear.

Since 1930, the last year of unrestricted exploitation of the fishery, the catch per unit of gear has increased by 61 per cent, in the area which includes the waters off British Columbia and the southerly part of Alaska and by 35 per cent. in the adjoining area to the north. These are the two most important areas among the four into which the fishing grounds have been divided for regularity and statistical purposes under the international fisheries commission, or, as it is popularly known, the Pacific halibut commission.
