Proposed Changes In Telephone Service In Nova Scotia

Petition Has Been Presented To Utilities Board.

Halifax-Approval of changes in the telephone system now in effect in Nova Scot a is sought by the Maritime Telegraph and Telephone Company in a petition presented to the Public Utilities Board. If approved, the new schedule will:

Put into effect a "station to station" service, now in use in all the other provinces of Canada;

Make the cost of such service less than the present "person to person" service;

Retain the present "person to person" service for those desiring direct communication with a named person;

Lengthen hours during which night rates are effective, making the period from 7.00 p.m. to 7.00 a.m., instead of from 8.30 p.m. to

Make the time at which night rates become effective conform to local time, that is Daylight Saving Time in centres where it has been adopted;

Establish a "person to person" service at a reduced night rate;

Making night rates for "station to station" calls approximately 40 per cent. less than the day rates.
