

"Les Miserables" Is To Be Feature At Capitol Theatre

Hugo Film Has Especial Appeal To The Lovers Of Literature.

Frederic March, Charles Laughton and Sir Cedric Hardwicke head the brilliant cast of "Les Miserables," Darryl Zanuck's 20th Century production of the Victor Hugo classic, which comes to the Capitol Theatre all next week.

March is seen as the hero, Jean Valjean, who spends five bitter years in the galleys of a French prison ship for the theft of a loaf of bread and finds his whole life shadowed by this petty crime.

Laughton is cast as Javert, the fanatical detective who hounds him and Hardwicke plays the beneficent Bishop Bienvenu whose kindness and trust launches the brutalized convict on the road to a nobler life.

Richard Boleslawski directed "Les Miserables" from a screen play by W. P. Lipscomb. The distinguished pair worked in the same capacities on Zanuck's recent production of "Clive of India."

Rochelle Hudson, Frances Drake, Florence Eldridge—who is Mrs. Frederic March in private life—Jessie Ralph and little Marilynne Knowlden head the feminine contingent of the supporting cast while John Beal, who scored in the title role of "The Little Minister," and Ferdinand Gottschalk are prominent among the supporting males in this Joseph M. Schenck presentation released through United Artists.

Plan For Improvement

THERE are many dwellings in Saint John that are in need of repair and improvement. Some districts in this city are in a state verging on what might be termed slum conditions. The Provincial Government has taken steps to co-operate with the city authorities in providing money for property owners to carry on with the improvements deemed necessary.

The plan as presented to the City Council by Hon. Mr. Tilley has much merit. If the scheme is put into effect it will tend to eliminate undesirable conditions and give many people better homes. The plan is a repairing scheme and does not provide for the erection of new houses. It would give owners of property a chance to secure money at a low rate of interest and carry on the needed repairs. In addition to this the carrying out of the plan would provide employment for carpenters, electricians, plumbers, masons and others who need work and wages.

If the Council decides to go ahead with the plans it would, no doubt, be greatly appreciated by a great many citizens.

Subsequent provincial hook-ups through stations CHSJ, Saint John; CKCW, Moncton; CFNB, Fredericton, and CHNC, New Carlisle will be as follows:

June 13—Hon. A. J. Leger, Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, will speak from Moncton; June 19—Hon. D. A. Stewart, Minister of Public Works, will speak from Campbellton; June 20—Hon. W. H. Harrison, Attorney-General, will speak from Saint John; June 24—Hon. Lewis Smith, Minister of Agriculture, will speak from Moncton, and on June 26, Premier Tilley will address the province from the Saint John station, CHSJ.

This modern method of electioneering is bringing political discussion right into the homes of the people in city and country alike and, Premier Tilley remarked in a recent address, it is certain the more general hearing of the discussion of public affairs will induce a still greater vote on the 27th of this month, particularly among the younger citizens casting their first ballot and naturally keen in upholding a vigorous policy, one that has bridged the late drab years of depression without impairing the credit of the province or demoralizing its people.

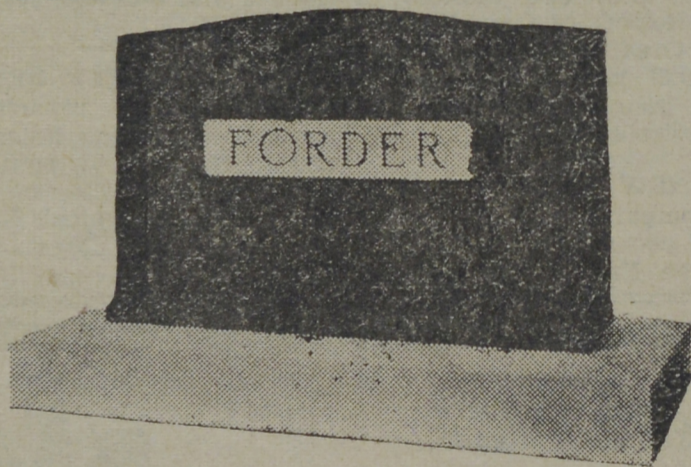
