**Refused** Admission To Canada

Actress Goes Back To Shanghai on Freighter From Vancouver, B. C.

(By Central Press Canadian) Vancouver.—After being the "guest" of Canadian immigration authorities in Vancouver for more than a month, Gertrud Keul will sail on a freighter for Shanghai. An actress who has made appearances in many European cities under the name of Mary Kid, she was refused admission to Canada, although authorities offered to grant her permission to cross the Dominion en route to Europe.

Miss Keul's troubles really started at Honolulu when the Empress of Asia docked on her way from the Orient. She had boarded the liner at Shanghai, expecting to be able to proceed through Vancouver to Hollywood, where she planned to visit Marlene Dietrich, the well-known German star, and Michel Curtes, a director for whom she played in Germany.

The United States immigration department didn't favor her jaunt to the movie centre, however, and turned thumbs down on her application.


