

Around the Maritimes

Instructions were issued by the Department of Lands and Mines in Fredericton that all woods permits in the province will be cancelled until further notice. This announcement was made as a means of combatting the serious forest fire situation that has been threatening many parts of New Brunswick.

J. McK. Sinclair of New Glasgow will be the sole Nova Scotian cadet who will begin studies at the Royal Military College at Kingston, Ontario, on August 31, according to an announcement from the Department of National Defence. All nine provinces are represented with Ontario having 36 enrolled.

The Nova Scotia hay crop varies from fair to average, the weekly telegraphic crop report of the Bank of Montreal states and grains are heading on short straw with only average yields indicated. Root crops are average, the report states, and apples satisfactory with pastures fair to good.

Improved methods of gathering, packing and shipping New Brunswick's potato crop, with the aim of making a stronger appeal to outside markets, is the object of an educational campaign being launched by the New Brunswick Department of Agriculture. Announcement to this effect was made by Hon. A. C. Taylor, Minister of Agriculture.

Digby's annual Hospital Fair took place on Wednesday of this week, on the grounds and in the Manhattan Hotel building. Folks, not only residents of Digby, but those of nearby towns and communities take a great interest in its success and make valuable contributions in the way of fancy work, cooking, etc., which are sold at the various booths.

Acting for the A.M.W. of N.S., W. A. D. Gun, Sydney barrister, has had writs issued in Sydney, charging five men prominent in the ranks of the U.M.W. at Springhill, with loss of wages amounting to several thousand dollars as well as damages, due five men who as members of the A.M.W., have been allegedly blacklisted and unable to get work in the Springhill collieries.

A blonde-haired lad from Farmington, N.S., captured the spotlight at Lake William, N.S., last week in what is regarded as one of the greatest exhibitions of

A visiting party of United States agronomists, headed by Prof. Ralph Donaldson of the Agricultural College of Amherst, Mass., after inspecting the scientifically developed pastures at the Dominion Experimental Station at Fredericton, said that the work done along this line is the most advanced in North America. This station was a pioneer in pasture improvement work in Canada, beginning in the year 1923, and dairy farmers throughout the province have benefited.

The impressive service carried out each year prior to the opening of the lobster fishing season when the fleet of fishing boats are blessed was held this year last Thursday afternoon at Cape Bauld wharf, parish of Botsford, by the pastor of Cape Bauld, Rev. Father Donat Robichaud. The Cape Bauld parish is one of the few parishes in Canada which observes this ancient custom which is probably handed down by old settlers of the St. Malo district of France.

The Pictou Fire Department is laying plans for the 1936 Maritime Firemen's Tournament, to be held in Pictou in July. Visiting firemen will register on Monday, and the tournament will continue with sports and entertainments until Thursday evening. A tentative list of events is as follows: Hose reel race, for a cash prize and the La France Cup now held by Glace Bay; ladder race; hose coupling contest; replacement race; 100 yard dash; veterans' race for retired firemen over 50 years of age; relay race, and other events to be organized.

Growers and shippers of potatoes in New Brunswick are predicting that there probably will be a shortage for table-stock markets this year in the province. Extensive curtailment of the yield, with nature assisting the growers who reduced their acreage by a total of about 25 per cent. for the province at large, will bring about an improvement in the price, with the possibility of a dollar or more a barrel being offered by winter. The price dropped to ten or 15 cents a barrel last year, and some growers were unable to give their potatoes away, large quantities being destroyed in the spring this year.

Tender of C. V. Norris for installation of steam heating plant in the Civic Building, was accepted at the regular meeting of the Windsor Town Council last week. His was the lowest local tender. Other bids were submitted by Power Bros. Ltd., Lunenburg and H. P. Murphy, Windsor. Norris' tender was \$40 lower than the Murphy bid. George Wilson, of Curry's Corner, was re-appointed chief assessor, William C. Dunlop and E. B. Marshall re-appointed

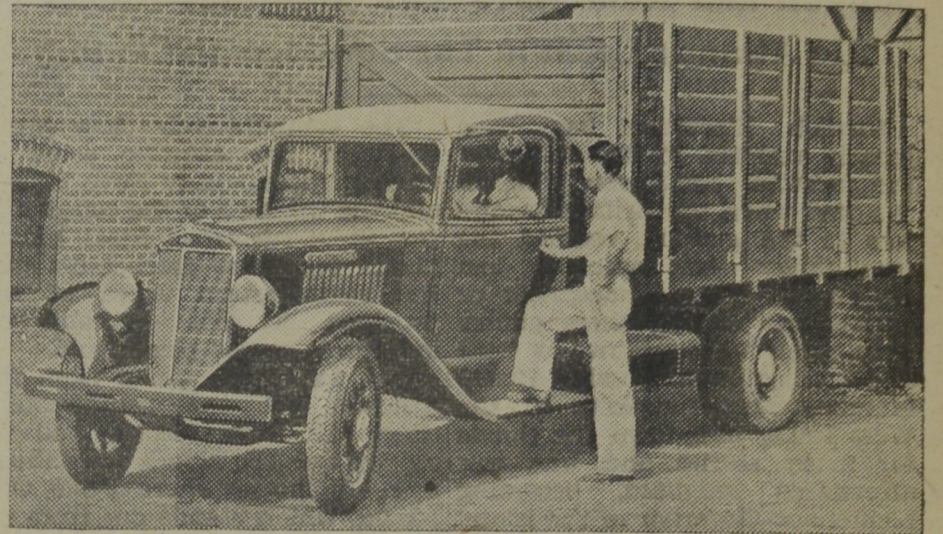

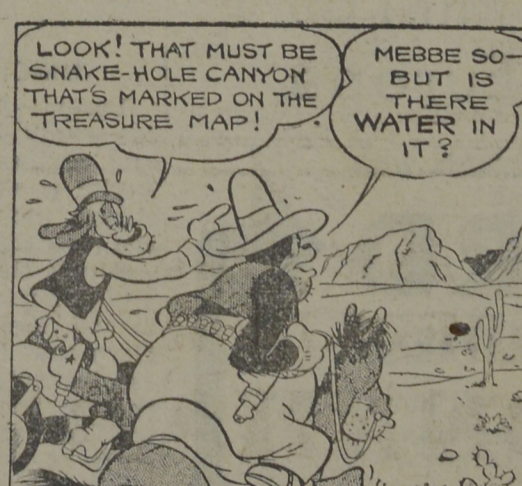
