FARMING INDUSTRY THREATENED

For Giving Aid To Small Industries

Plan Might Be Worked Out to Benefit Whole Community.

Small industries in all parts of New Brunswick are struggling under the handicap of insufficient capital. Many of these could do a much larger business if they had the cash to put into materials when conditions were favorable.

Several operators of smaller industries have taken up the matter of their condition with the members of the City Council and it is believed that many of these businesses would grow to large proportions if provided with financial stimulant. However, under present conditions no help is in sight and some one had suggested that some kind of an organization be launched to provide money in small quantities to struggling and worthy industries.
