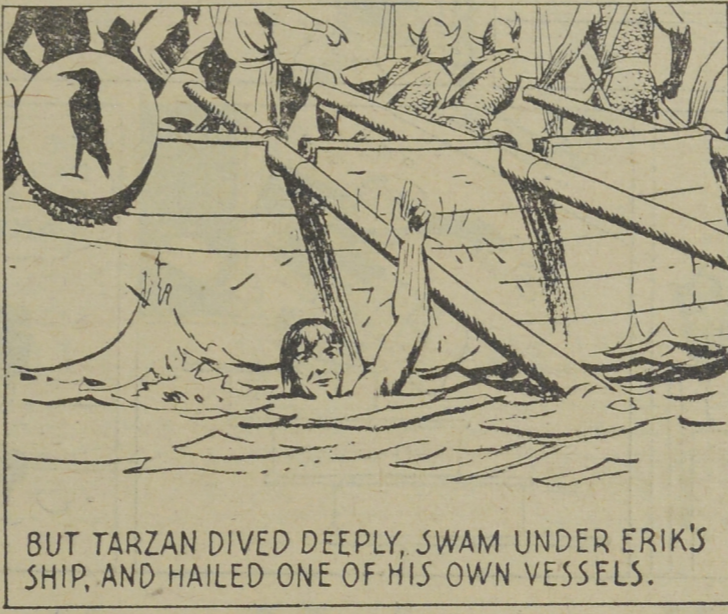

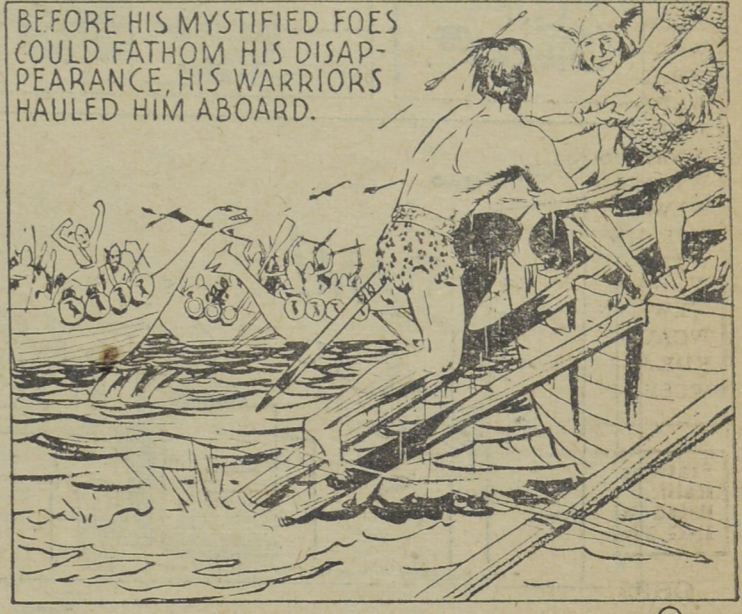
MUTINY!



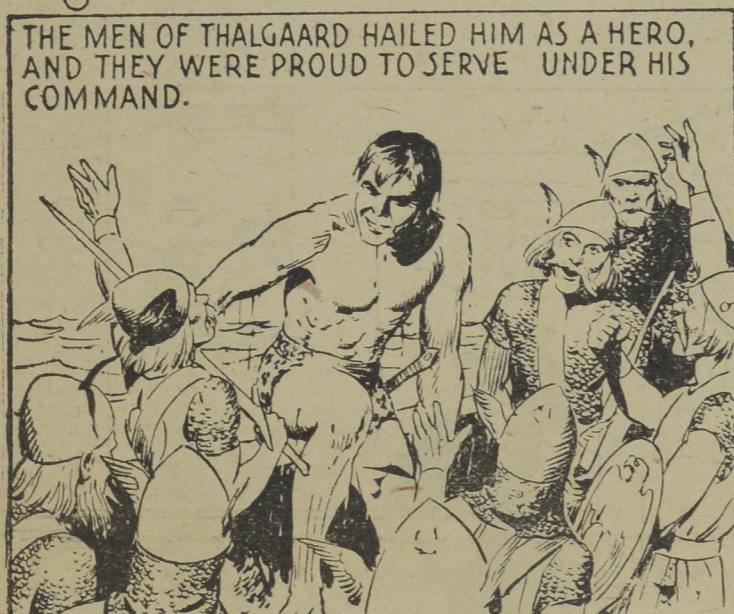
AS TARZAN PLUNGED FROM THE BURNING SHIP, ERIK'S ARCHERS RELEASED A FLIGHT OF ARROWS.



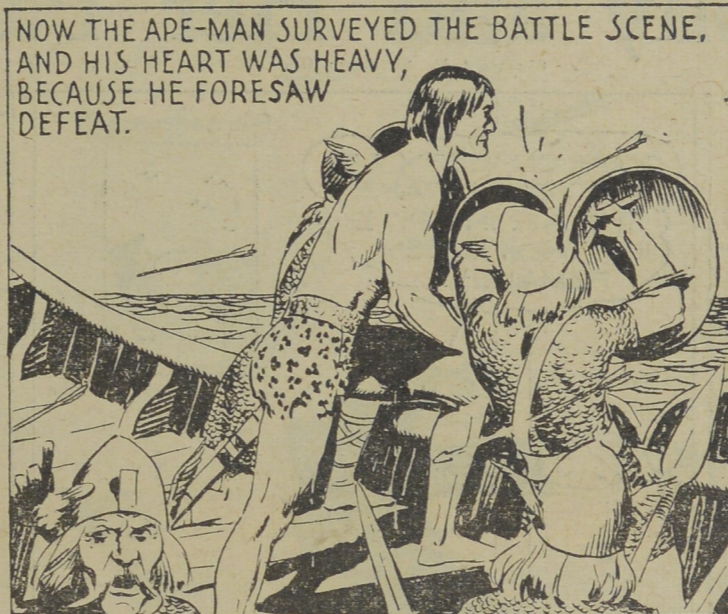

THE MEN OF THALGAARD HAILED HIM AS A HERO, AND THEY WERE PROUD TO SERVE UNDER HIS COMMAND.



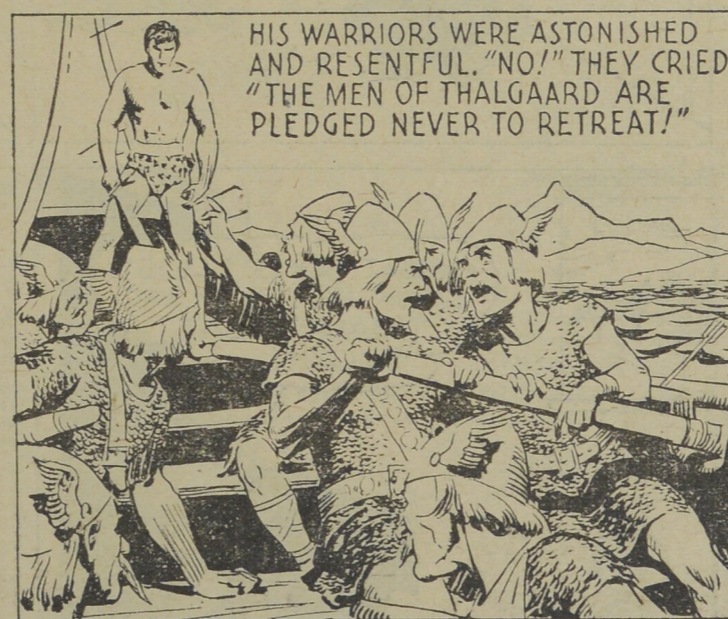

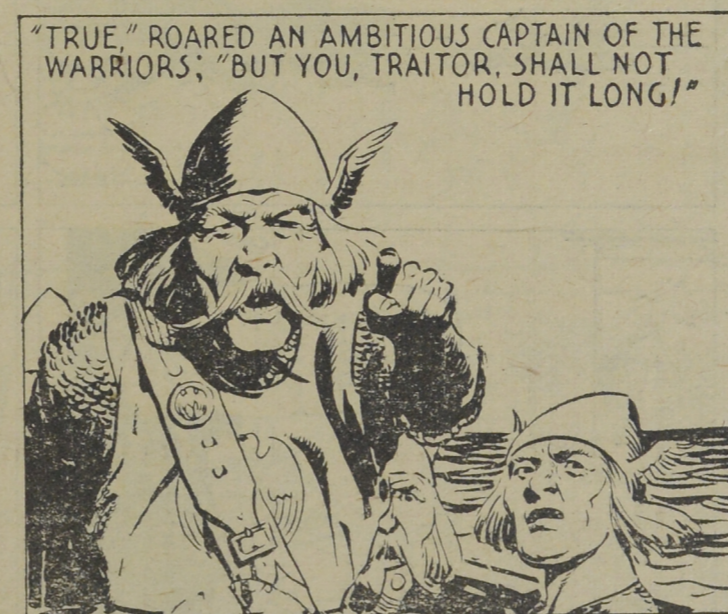
