

## New Harbor Work To Start At Once

### Mayor Brittain Commended For Work in Behalf of the Port.

The contract for the construction of berths 1, 2, 3 and 4 in Saint John harbor have been let and work on the site is to start immediately. More than \$2,000,000 is to be spent on the work and it is expected that many men will find employment on this job.

At a recent meeting of the City Council satisfaction was expressed that this work was to be started and the commissioners commended Mayor Brittain for his untiring efforts in this connection. It was pointed out that Mayor Brittain had made frequent trips to Ottawa in connection with this work. He had presented the case of the port to the authorities and the success of his negotiations is evidenced by the fact that the work is to start immediately.

## The Smaller Industries

THE SUGGESTION that financial help be made available for small deserving industries, which was suggested at a meeting of the Common Council and of which some of the details have been outlined to members of the Industrial Commission and the Board of Trade, is worthy of consideration. However, financial help alone will never build up industries or keep those in business alive. There must be more business.

Mr. George P. Hamm hit the troublesome nail on the head when he said one of the greatest drawbacks of small industries is the lack of support given the products by the consumer. Mr. H. H. Scovil drove the nail in further when he expressed the thought that merchants and clerks should be educated to sell home products.

The correction of these two detriments to the welfare of the smaller industries will be a much more valuable aid to their successful operation than mere financial assistance. The small industry that has a consumer acceptance of its products and the co-operation of the retailers will, if properly managed, find little difficulty in getting the financial help required.

Many of the smaller industries are suffering from lack of finances due, in many cases, to the fact that the costs of selling are high and because they are not receiving the necessary support from the consumers.

For many months this paper has been stressing the need of all communities supporting their local industries and buying home products whenever possible. It has been pointed out that by keeping the home money in circulation at home work and wages are being provided for Maritime people. When the people of Saint John and of the Maritimes fully realize the importance of supporting their own businesses, then and then only, will we build up our industries. The consumer must be encouraged to buy by the merchants displaying prominently Maritime products.

There are still some merchants, who, while asking the public to support them, are pushing imported or foreign lines of goods, which means that the money spent with them goes out of the Provinces. The merchant and the manufacturer who are depending on the Maritime consumer, should realize the importance of themselves buying their needs in the Maritimes. What is needed is co-operation between the Maritime manufacturer, producer, merchant, and consumer. When this co-operation comes, industry in the Maritimes will go ahead by leaps and bounds and unemployment will be at a low ebb.
